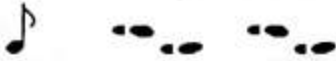

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK:
The following are synopses of past meeting minutes:

Membership Meeting-May 4, 1994 at Juke Box Cafe. Committee Reports included membership-(we decided to advise non-members that if they want to continue receiving the newsletter they will need to join Club); newsletter-(need to submit articles, pictures or information to Janis Grimes prior to the end of the month); lessons-be on time. Bylaws required election of three new Directors. Nominations were: Larry Boyer, Larry Camp, Gary Salpini, Janis Grimes and Donna Harrington. We had to vote twice due to ties! Your new Directors are Janis Grimes, Larry Camp and Gary Salpini. Congratulations!

Board Meeting May 11, 1994 at the Juke Box Cafe. First Board of Directors Organizational Meeting. Charlie Price presented our official Certificate of Incorporation dated 3/29/94. Dee Bassett read membership-approved Bylaws. Both were filed in minute book. Resolutions--Crestar Bank designated for corporation's checking account; Dee Bassett, Pres. and Dave Rapson, Treas. are authorized co-signers; timing of fund raising event decided to be held in March, 1995; future Board meetings are to be held first Monday of each month at Dee's home.

Board Meeting June 6, 1994 at Dee Bassett's home. Resolutions--charities (Club shall volunteer money or services for smaller, local charitable organizations--subject to change as needs arise; Annual Event-Fund Raiser slated for the 10th, 11th & 12th of March, 1995 [location to be determined]; Logo colors determined to be black, gold and turquoise (aqua blue). Other items-Dee to order membership cards upon receipt of camera ready art; Club banner for functions-Gary will have art work for final approval at next meeting--cost is \$125.00 (approved); Promos--shag tags, Virginia Beach Sunday Socials, radio station ads, flyers on tables Wednesday nights, Volunteers for Easter Seal Concert,

and sending flyers to non-members asking them to join our Club.

Special Board Meeting June 22, 1994 at the Juke Box Cafe. Meeting was called to get approval of ordering additional Club shirts since shirt prices are going up at the end of the month. Board decided to investigate cost of obtaining golf type/polo shirts with smaller logo on light aqua shirts. Libby to advise Board of costs of shirts and get approval prior to order.

LATE BREAKING NEWS--WORKSHOP IN AUGUSTA, GEORGIA!

As you may know, Dee Bassett has been working hard to get our Club approved for membership in the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs (ACSC). In order to do that, many requirements had to be met. First, we had to get organized and be able to answer a certain number of questions contained in the application prior to submission. Application was made, then Dee had to attend a certain number of ACSC Workshops, one of which Dee and I attended this weekend in Augusta, Georgia (it was my first). Well, at that meeting, ACSC determined that we will be sponsored by Virginia Beach Shag Club who will come and check our Club out. This has to be done prior to SOS this fall! Once this has been accomplished, we will be voted on at the next workshop. Then, we'll be official members! I took five pages of notes. If any members are interested in reading them I'll have them available at the next few Wednesday night meetings.

The ACSC Workshop was hosted by the CSRA Shag Club (I believe that stands for Central Savannah River Association). Everyone was friendly, the dance floor was huge, the food was good, and what more can I say. The only bad part about our trip was the airline flight! It reminded Dee and I of a terrible bus trip! (But, we'll get over it!)

Sunday, May 29, 1994, 7th annual *MEMORIAL* parade, Washington, D.C.

They call it Rolling Thunder! Picture me riding on the back seat of a white Harley Davidson parading from the Pentagon through the streets of D.C. to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial with over 40,000 motorcycles. Picture me with the elite *Nam Knights* of New York and New Jersey riding near the front of the parade, so positioned because of the size and age of the club and the charitable things that they do. Picture the view behind me...a trail of 40,000 plus motorcycles of all sorts, shapes, and colors with a diversity of riders, passengers, accessories, and attachments filling the street...fringe and USA/MIA flags flying...each light beam glowing. Then picture the starting point, the north parking lot of the Pentagon, covered with motorcycles. Imagine the roar of 40,000 motorcycles starting their engines, leaping forward, raring to go. Picture the procession as they leave the Pentagon, four abreast, following a truck blaring *God Bless The USA*, flags flying. Crowds of people line the streets...pressing forward and reaching out, smiling, cheering, waving, saluting, giving those guys a pride-swelling thumbs up...men and women choked with emotion, weeping. Still photography and video cameras abound, but how, I wonder, could any photograph or video capture the enormity of the scene or the emotion of it...the continuous thunder of the engines lasting for at least an hour and a half as they pass...the skill of the motorcyclists...the sounds of the horns and sirens...the mix of the crowd itself, from a lady clad in a red, white and blue bikini to veterans clad in scruffy fatigues, and from young to old. How could a photograph portray all those parading veterans and their ladies with their long hair, tattoos and black leather vests, jackets, fringe, and hip high boots. The long hair, shaggy beards and tattoos are not mere adornment. They offer symbolic tribute to fallen and missing war veterans and are worn with extreme pride. I marveled at the men and women, especially women, of all sizes, shapes and ages skillfully driving those monstrous motorcycles across country to come here from every direction. Imagine the amount of money it took for them to get here, motorcycles costing as much as \$12,000. Imagine the cumulative value of 40,000 motorcycles. Imagine a crisp, sunny day in Washington, D.C., warm, but not energy-sucking hot. Imagine me having the experience of a lifetime and feeling very privileged. Well, that's the way it was. No where else but in America.

Riding with them, little did I know that I'd gain a greater understanding of the Vietnam era veterans, their suffering, and the camaraderie and loyalty that they share. They still don't get the public support and respect they deserve, but they give it to one another. And that's why they ride. Thanks again to Jay, Jack, Greg, Kenny and the *Nam Knights* for letting us outsiders join them even though we didn't pay any dues.

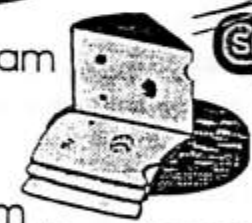
