FREE SHAG LESSONS at 7:30 sharp every Wednesday night given by NVSC members. Our volunteers do a good job of teaching beginner and intermediate steps, and you should take advantage of this FREE opportunity to learn to Shag, the Carolina way! *You Can Do It!*



Shagging Tips

• Listen to the Beat of the music, and Step On the Beat.

- Shag is danced on a slot in a back and forth movement, not in a circular movement. Imagine that your hand is on a post that you're moving toward and away from.
- Take SMALL STEPS for better control.
- Body movement is basically from the waist down, with knees slightly bent.

SOME FURTHER LEARNING TIPS:

1. Learn in small doses; don't expect to learn everything at once. Be patient and kind to yourself, and give yourself time to learn. Don't make unreasonable demands on yourself or your dance partner. Dancing is fun, and learning should be fun, too!
2. Take notes, and review them later the same evening. Practice by yourself (yes, alone!), and go over new steps in your mind --you'll progress much faster if you do.
3. Measure your progress against your own previous performance, not against the couple dancing next to you, and especially not competitors!
4. Get used to practicing without feeling embarrassed on the dance floor. People are watching the better dancers anyway, so don't sweat it!
5. Don't scold or argue with your dance partner; it does not lead to making progress. Keep things in perspective and "light."

**MEMBERSHIP MEETING OF THE
NORTHERN VIRGINIA SHAG CLUB**

The quarterly meeting of Northern Virginia Shag Club was held Monday, July 11, 1994 at Heatherwood Retirement Community, 9642 Burke Lake Road, Burke, Virginia 22015 at 7:30 p.m. [Dee's place of work-- Thank you, Dee!] The membership discussed the cost of printing and mailing the newsletters. [Please refer to Sharon Salpini's article in last month's newsletter.] A Membership Committee was formed-- Sharon Salpini, Chairperson, Donna Harrington, Charlie Price and James Taylor. [Please contact one of the above-named if you need flyers or have prospective members, etc.] Charity Committee--Members discussed options. It is not a requirement for joining ACSC but it does give club more benefits, especially clubs which operate under corporations not for profit. Donna Harrington and Gary Salpini made presentations on charities they had researched. The members motioned to accept SOME (the charity for elderly and homeless) as the Club's official charitable organization. It was so voted. Meeting Place for Weekly Dances-- Dave Rapson reported on several places that he had visited and many were not suitable (dance floor too small), or not accommodating (dining hours conflicted), or affordable (the restaurants/clubs were seeking generous revenues from our patronage). Matter was left open and members agreed (to Dee's suggestion) that we would make a field trip to Fast Eddies on Thursday to see for ourselves how it might work out. Members plan to go Thursday, July 14th. [Post note: we went, we ate, we danced, we played our own music--afterwards it was pointed out to management at Fast Eddies that they did not have a dance permit. Therefore, they cannot allow dancing there at this time. Also, by membership phone call, members made field trip to Champions on Tuesday, August 23rd. Attendance was high and a great time was had. Dave Rapson will follow up with report on how receptively we were received by management of Champions.] Members did not vote for a move at this

time as they want to visit other facilities. Members agreed that our Club is outgrowing the Juke Box. Shirts--Dee displayed samples of three different shirts. She encouraged members to advise Libby Hendrix as to what members prefer (as to style, color and size). Also, Dee welcomed members to inform Libby if they have a good source for obtaining tee shirts at a practical price and to submit bids. We have the options of having embroidery or screen print placed on the shirts. [Post note-- a thank you is extended to the members for their input regarding shirt preferences. I will have follow up questionnaire and report on this soon.] Shag Tags--Donna Harrington reported that checks were sent in and were payable to the DMV but we do not know if the person in charge of this project secured enough people to accomplish the processing of the Shag Tags. [It is believed that they need approximately 30 more commitments.] Larry Camp mentioned that after the checks are six months old we will need to re-write out-dated. [Direct any questions to Donna Harrington re this matter. Events--Donna reported her findings on the possibility of getting dinner/dance group on the Dandy. The minimum number of patrons required to book the Dandy is (50) but no guarantee of our shag music being played. Requirement of 125 bookings will enable us to have our shag music played. Then the cost would be approximately \$25.50 per person for the evening. Since this did not seem feasible, the idea was not further discussed. Advertising-- Donna called radio stations and asked why our announcements were not aired. She was told if our club sponsors a charity, we would get quicker results (for public service announcements). Also, we can buy time on Johnnie Dark's show or sponsor traffic reports (WBIG 100.3). Sherri Bassham mentioned that she needs a promo Charlie Byrd tape so she can present it to WBIG radio station for the possibility of having Charlie Byrd's program aired on a Saturday or Sunday. [Charlie sometimes deejay's at Razzle's Lounge in Richmond,

Virginia and some of his syndicated programs can be heard on radio stations throughout the south.] Dee advised that she would forward Charlie's promo tape to Sherry asap. Sherri will make appointment with Al Santos of WBIG to present it. Workshops--Donna advised that Steve Booth of Richmond Shag Club volunteered his time & talents to give shag lessons/workshop. Donna is to see what his availability is for September or October and will report back to Club. Peter Jones of Virginia Beach is also willing to return to give lessons/workshop. Committee will find out if there will be a fee for his services. Teaching--Charlie Price voiced his opinion that he suspected we were losing members [prospective members] because we did not have structured dance lessons and, lessons did not start on time. Dee pointed out that she attended most of the Wednesday night functions and was there to instruct whoever (and whenever--at various times she would be interrupted during the course of the evening) desired to learn to shag, or learn a new step. Eddy Farmer interjected with a THANK YOU to Dee for putting in her time and efforts to keep this club going. There was mention of starting lessons later in the evening. Dee pointed out that it was best to start lessons before Bert started playing the music as beginners really cannot get the rhythm and count at the same time! Libby volunteered to teach beginners but not on an every week basis. Donna Harrington pointed out that she would like to see structured lessons for intermediate dancers as well. There were no volunteers for the job of organizing the structured lessons, therefore discussion was dropped. [Post note--After the meeting, Ruth Rapson volunteered to organize a calendar of volunteer teachers of beginning and intermediate shag. Therefore, give Ruth your support--VOLUNTEER!!!] There being no further business, meeting was adjourned. RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED, LIBBY HENDRIX, SECRETARY
