The new officers and board members will take office January 1, 1995. Another year of Fun, Friends, Good Music, and Dance, Dance, Dance.

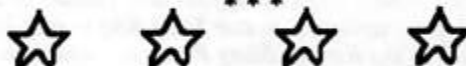

THE SHAG

If you're a lover of America's own great music, get ready for the waves of beach music and learn to Shag.

In the summers of the 50's, the college kids vacationing at the beaches in North and South Carolina were exposed to a new type of music. It wasn't the music of the hit parade or the Ed Sullivan Show that their parents listened to -- it was called Rhythm and Blues, and beach people were doing a new dance to this music, and it was called "the Shag."

The kids loved their newly discovered music, but when they returned home to Raleigh, Charlotte or Richmond, the new music was not to be heard -- so it was back to the beach for "beach music."

The Shag is the official dance of the State of South Carolina. It has become an art form with

unlimited precision steps such as the sugarfoot, belly roll and boogie walk.

Twice a year in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, there is a reunion of Association of Carolina Shag Clubs. Clubs from South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, Georgia, Tennessee, and Florida that represent about 11,700 members meet there to dance the night away. A Thank-You Party For Us!

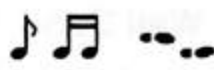

SHAG & BOP

Comparison and Contrast



A Study of Two Similar But Different Dance Styles in 4/4 Time — by Phil Sawyer



You "lag to shag;" you "hop to bop." Shagging is lazy; bopping is aerobic. Shagging is a slow jitterbug; bopping is a fast, dynamic combination of the Lindy and the Disco.

How are they so much alike? Why are they so different? Grab yourself a "blue hand Bud" and hang on! I'm gonna try to answer these questions. I am sure that there will be those who will disagree with my observations. That's fine. That's why we have Democrats and Republicans, shaggers and boppers.

Let's start with shag. (That's the one I know the most about.) I've been around it a long, long time. I learned to shag in the mid-forties, and like everyone else of the era, sort of adapted it from the jitterbug. The shag was born somewhere on the Atlantic seaboard between Virginia Beach and Savannah. No one knows exactly where or what year. It just evolved.

One thing is certain. The slower, sultry, sexy moods of the black rhythm and blues bands had a lot to do with it. On the North and South Carolina coast, Billy Ward and The Dominoes, Bull Moose Jackson, The Tams, and The Clovers began to nudge the big bands of Tommy Dorsey and Glenn Miller off the juke boxes; and the small pavilion dance floors became the social meccas of generations of teens and college

kids. It was a summer world of a cold beer on a warm night with a hot date and no plans for tomorrow.

Eight counts make up the basic shag step with the dancers moving into and away from each other with almost all of the motion from the waist down. There is little or no vertical movement from the waist up, and the shaggers do not veer to one side of the other. We dance "North and South," as we say, not East and West, and glide like nuns walk.

In the early days, shag was a male chauvinistic dance with the guy doing almost all the dancing and the girl anchoring or "being his doorknob." But that's all changed now, and the partners now share equal dancing time. There are many steps, and most of them are "murre." The fly-back, sugarfoot, duck walk, boogie walk, stutter step, pick, and lean are repertoire, and the queen steps of shagging are the pivot and "belly roll."

Bop is a far more vigorous dance. It has remained much more closely related to the jitterbug, from which it too descended. The added components seem to be disco related; and there is much more turning, crossing, and tossing. Boppers move all of their bodies in rhythmic sways and swings and move their heads, shoulders, hips, and legs in a never ending combination of complex steps

and moves. Boppers showcase the girls in a way that would make the Miss America green with envy. It is an awesome dance to watch and even more fun to do.

Boppers tend to use more floor space than shaggers do. Many good shaggers can do the whole record in a space not much larger than a hula hoop, while the entire floor might be needed for one good bop routine. Bop probably originated on ballroom and dance hall floors, which were larger by far than the original shagging floors.

While shag is a Carolina thing, bop is standard dance in Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee. We have come together under the umbrella of the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs, and the Spring and Fall editions of the S.O.S. (Society of Strangers) is the glue that holds us together. We meet and mingle well, dance with each other, and have genuine respect and admiration for each other's dance styles. It is our love of the music, the dance, the camaraderie, and the carefree times of a beach weekend together that makes it happen.

I am sure that anyone involved in the swing dance movement would be comfortable with a bop or shag event. We would love for you to join us, and we'll be coming your way soon.

- General Membership Meeting of the Northern Virginia Shag Club was held November 14, 1994 at Heatherwood Retirement Community, 9642 Burke Lake Road, Burke, Virginia at 7:00 p.m. Dee Bassett, President, called meeting to order. REPORTS AND OLD BUSINESS.....
Treasurer's Report was given by Ruth Rapson, due to Dave's absence. \$918.00 reported in the treasury. [Secretary was absent as well, therefore, no report. Ruth Rapson volunteered to take minutes. Thank you, Ruth.] It was noted that an audit of the books is needed before new officers step in. H.K. Lee, Carol Vann and John Belt volunteered to take on that duty.
- EVENTS.....Pauline Easby-Smith and Donna Harrington will be hosting a Christmas party on Saturday, December 17th for N.V.S.C. Members are requested to bring items for donation to SOME (N.V.S.C.'s designated charity). Also, possible 50/50 Raffle for donation to SOME. Dee donated Sunday Brunch passes (given to her by Blackies) to be given away as door prizes. [If other members have door prizes to donate, contact Libby, Donna or Pauline.] Watch for flyers detailing this event! Rick Hendrix reported on the Sonny & Judy Carver workshop held at Blackie's, Sat. Nov. 12th. It was a success. 40 people attended. Rick would like to schedule other workshops in March & June and proposed a Beach Blast in '95. Sonny and Judy were receptive to do a repeat workshop. [Rick is in contact with other instructors as well..stay tuned!]
- MEMBERSHIP.....Sharon Salpini reports 104 members. It was suggested that there be a special non-member rate set up for non-members attending our workshops. Their fee would include \$15 automatic membership into Club. Also, make an extra effort to be friendly to new members or prospective members--get them out of their seats & up dancing!
- NEWSLETTER.....Janis Grimes notes that deadline for submitting articles for the publication of SHAG RAG is 3rd Friday of the month.
- DANCE LESSONS...NVSC will continue to give free dance lessons at Juke Box. Jim Nanny volunteered to chair and co-ordinate dance lessons for remainder of '94. Members are reminded of dance courtesy. [We have a larger dance floor and can get more people on it. Be conscious of your surroundings and watch for dancers around you. Carolina Shag dancers keep their arms close to body and keep their footwork tight (small steps). Guys--lead your women well, keep them from hitting other dancers. Ladies--wear flats, no heels please. (It is destructive to floor, not to mention someone's foot or leg!)] Any complaints of rude or unruly dancers at Juke Box can be reported to John Belt. He will take it up with management.
- BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS.....Need volunteers to bring cake, cookies, etc. last Wed. at Juke Box. George Murray donated \$10 for November's party.
- NEW BUSINESS...Bylaws--Club has grown and during the year it has been necessitated to change different aspects of bylaws. Membership voted and approved to change language in bylaws "to provide its membership with free dance lessons, taught by members at regularly scheduled Club functions and opportunities to associate with others who likewise enjoy and promote Carolina Shag dancing". It was noted that this Club was not organized for any one's personal gain--the Club is strictly social for promoting Carolina Shag and not for profit.
- NEW OFFICERS...are invited to Dec. Board Mtg. Board will discuss bylaws [and meet with counter parts to turn over duties to new officers].
