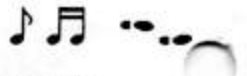

SHAG MUSIC AND ITS ICONS Godfather of R&B: Johnny Otis By Steve Booth

Somewhere in Southern California there is a semi-retired gentleman of Greek descent who dabbles in the organic food industry, radio and occasionally, music. He is 73 and his name is Johnny Veliotis. Raised in Berkeley, he lived among black folks and absorbed much of their culture, of course music being at the fore-front. He played drums in Swing bands and toured the Southwest. From the late 30's through 1960,

Robins, who evolved into the Coasters. Recording contracts soon followed with Modern and Savoy records starting in 1949. At this juncture, Otis's influence on R&B became immeasurable. His early discoveries included no less than Etta James and Little Esther Phillips. The string of hits on Savoy with this growing stable of stars led to the Johnny Otis

with his name Anglicized to Johnny Otis, he was the West Coast mover and shaker for the exploding Rhythm & Blues phenomenon. Otis's talents covered every facet of the music industry: producer, composer (*Roll With Me, Henry* 1954; *Every Beat Of My Heart* 1961), band leader. On top of that, Otis is a drummer, pianist, vibraphonist and singer.

Somewhere in Southern California there is a semi-retired gentleman of Greek descent ... He is 73 and his name is Johnny Veliotis.

Like the average reader, I had never heard of Johnny Otis (although I had heard of Shuggie Otis, his son, a guitarist of some note in my late 60's musician days) until I started researching R&B/Shag music history. This man's resumé is simply astounding. His orchestra recorded the original *Harlem Nocturne* in 1945. As Swing orchestras faded in the late 40's, Otis anticipated the change with the formation of a small, Louis Jordan-type combo to be the house band in his club "The Barrel House" in Watts. The talent contests at this club were legendary, with discoveries such as Mel Walker and the

Caravan. Well, you ask, What does this have to do with Shagging and our lifestyle?

In a recent interview with Gene Laughter, S.O.S. founder and certified early fifties O.D. Lifeguard/Beach Bum ... he made a statement that "music was the glue that held the O.D./Beach lifestyle together".

Just about everything. In a recent interview with Gene Laughter, S.O.S. founder and certified early fifties O.D. Lifeguard/Beach Bum, I asked Gene about his favorite artists of the era. He prefaced the list with the statement that "music was the glue that held the O.D./Beach lifestyle together". At the top of his fave list was Wynonie Harris, whose 1948 (!) hit (written by Roy Brown) *Good Rockin' Tonight* started the "Rock 'N' Roll" double entendre craze in early R&B. Not only can *Good Rockin' Tonight* still be heard (in the Solomon Burke version) at any Shag Throwdown, but Wynonie Harris was one of the early stars of Otis's *Caravan* show. But the list of superstars on the rise in the early 50's goes on: Willi Mae "Big Mama"

Thornton (*Hound Dog, Let Your Tears Fall, Baby*), Jackie Wilson, Hank Ballard, Johnny Ace, Charles Brown (*Please Come Home For Christmas* - the greatest Christmas R&B Tune). Otis's inclusion of these legends on his shows either enhanced their stardom or created their stardom through resulting recording contracts. The proliferation of authentic R&B outside of the great Southeast in the mid-50's is in part due to talents such as Johnny Otis, who knew the "real goods" when he heard it. Otis, himself, scored massively in 1958 with *Willie And The Hand Jive*, with its pounding, reverbed "Bo Diddley" beat of West African derivation. Next time you're on the dance floor pivoting to Etta James, Boogie Walking to *Lonely Teardrops* or Belly Rolling to *Open Up The Back Door*, thank Johnny Otis for his part in creating Rhythm & Blues - and our lifestyle.

Johnny Otis still has a radio show and recorded as recently as 1981.
