On Saturday, July 15, Donna, John and I attended the Summer Workshop of the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs in Fayetteville, NC.

The principal item of business was the election of new officers, and even though we do not yet have a vote (our new member probationary period will be up the end of this month!), the election was very interesting.

There was a groundswell of support among the delegates present for candidates other than those nominated by the ACSC's nominating committee. And, from the nominating speeches, and the candidates' remarks, it was obvious that many delegates felt that the national leadership had become too remote from the association's members. After the first round of voting, only one of the ACSC-nominated candidates - FOSTER McKINNEY - who was nominated for Treasurer, had won, and the two floor-nominated candidates for President were tied and had to go through a run-off election!

After all was said and done, your new ACSC officers are:
CHAIRPERSON - RON WHISENANT, Rock Hill Shag Club, SC (one of the three original co-founders of ACSC back in 1984, who served two terms as ACSC's first Chairman from '84-'85);
CO-CHAIRPERSON - MIKE RINK, Twister's Shag Club, Huntersville, NC (the founding President of Twister's Shag Club);
TREASURER - FOSTER McKINNEY, Columbia Shag Club, SC (SOS Corporate Treasurer from '89 to present); and
SECRETARY - LYNN NORTHRUP, Tampa Bay Beach Boppers, Clearwater, FL (Lynn is moving to Loris, SC next month!).

I can only say that I am very encouraged by the new slate of officers elected to run our national association. I was very impressed by their expressed desire to listen to the local clubs and their new ideas for managing ACSC, particularly its budget. (For those of you who are not aware, both the ACSC and SOS, a corporation wholly owned by ACSC, are substantial financial operations, together having an annual income in excess of \$500,000.00, most of which, after expenses, goes to charity!)

People also took notice to see me stuck on an incline, unable to move my foot from brake to clutch (I don't drive like that today).

Then there was the time I lost control on the PA Turnpike in a snowstorm, twirled around a few times and slid off backwards down the slope . . . braked . . . shifted . . . waited for traffic to clear . . . pulled back on the Turnpike, and continued on. I saw them watching when I had to get out of the car, hammer in hand, lift the hood, tap on the battery terminals . . . and repeat the procedure until the car started. And, yes, I guess to those who saw us, we looked kinda funny, barefoot, wearing shorts, digging the car's wheels out of a mound of snow . . . just seeking relief from Tucson heat below. Driving and shifting gears with three girls riding in the two front seats was a sight. . . Straw hat hanging from the antenna . . . it never occurred to us that the police might frown on that, but they did not see us. And, though I didn't see this myself, the thought of it makes me chuckle today . . . Frank pulling the car uphill, chain swung over his shoulder. . . friend, Jim, pushing from the back.

Yes, the car received lots of notice. . . but folks didn't see everything that happened. . . and though I'm sure it could talk if it wanted to, it never told. Neither did it ask how it survived me without a dent.

SOS Fall Migration Sept. 8-17 in North Myrtle Beach, S.C.

It's that time of year again, Shaggers -- time to head for Fall Migration at Myrtle Beach, S.C., for ten full days of sun, beach, party, party, and dance, dance, dance as long as your feet and legs hold up!

For those of you who have not yet gone to S.O.S., it is the best time you could ever imagine. Where else would you find over 10,000 people dancing, partying and generally having a ball, in once place, at one time -- and all because of a regional dance called the Shag? That's right -- for ten days each spring and fall, Shaggers from all over the country flock back to Ocean Drive in North Myrtle Beach to celebrate and perpetuate the best party in the world -- S.O.S.

The Association of Carolina Shag Clubs hosts these events by the Society of Stranders (S.O.S.), named after the 35-mile stretch of beach along the South Carolina coast called the Grand Strand. Shag DJs keep the beach music euphoria going from 10 a.m. until *waaay* after midnight (*I've heard it goes on until 2 or 3 a.m. each night, but have not yet lasted that long, myself!*).

You will need an S.O.S. pass (cost \$35) to be able to go back and forth between all the clubs and lounges (last year we counted twelve (12) dance floors within a few block radius!). It is well worth the cost, believe it!

Come join the party at S.O.S. in Myrtle Beach -- Shag Mecca, a dancer's paradise.
