It was exhilarating! It was exciting! It was a party! It was like being on a daring adventure away from normal life. It was a dance! Suspended in time, swaying, flowing, moving with the music... unaware of all that exists outside of the dance itself.

I wondered if I would get home safely, yet I was in no hurry to get there. I was cold, but I didn't feel cold. It was scary, yet I was not afraid. It was late, but I was wide awake. I was alone, although I had lots of company. There were many people around... around me... all preoccupied with the same task as I... negotiating the ice-covered roads.

Now why, you ask, is a single, middle-aged woman on the road driving in extremely hazardous conditions late at night in a car that's fourteen years old? Why isn't she indoors where it's cozy, safe and warm... forewarned of the danger lurking outside? The only answer I can give is that the "beach music was still playing... there were dances yet to be danced." I was oblivious to the weather leaving Blackie's on that Wednesday night, December 13th. My first hint of icy roads came as I went up and around the ramp to get onto 495 N. and met two cars facing in my direction. One of the drivers was out of his car, slipping and sliding across ice towards the other car. From that moment on, it was Katie Bar The Door!

During the next two hours, two people ask me if I need help, one person asked me to help him, and I asked someone for help. I see cars rammed in fences, stuck in ditches, cars abandoned, cars immobilized by ice, cars slippin' and slidin', and I regret to say, several pile-ups. Diverted from the main road by a police barrier, I, along with many others (*what are all these people doing out so late on a night like this?!*) attempt to get back to the main road only to be thwarted by ice.

I see two young men, their tires squealing uphill, and I hear their nervous laughter when they reach the top. The air is crisp and clean. The trees sparkle and glisten with ice, reflecting off the lights against the darkness of the night. I am surrounded by diamonds! It is beautiful out here! I leave my car and go in search of change for a dollar and a phone to call my family to tell them I am okay... I'm okay, I just can't get home! Shall I leave my car and walk? No, walking on ice is as dangerous as driving on ice. I push onward and finally come upon a main road that has been salted. Soon I'm home. Oh no! The music has stopped! The dance has ended! I go inside. It is warm, cozy and safe.

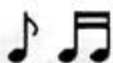
