### S.O.S. Fall Migration

**Sept. 6-15 in North Myrtle Beach, S.C.**

It's that time of year again, Shaggers -- time to head for Fall Migration at North Myrtle Beach, S.C., for ten full days of beach, sun, party, party, and dance, dance, dance as long as your feet and legs hold up!

For those of you who have not yet been to S.O.S., it is the best time you could ever imagine. Where else can you find over 5,000 friends (old and new!) dancing, partying and generally having a ball, in one place, at one time -- and all because of a regional dance called the Shag? That's right -- for ten days each spring and fall, shaggers from all over the country flock back to Ocean Drive in North Myrtle Beach to celebrate and perpetuate the best party in the world -- S.O.S.

The Association of Carolina Shag Clubs hosts these events by the **Society of Stranders (S.O.S.)**, named after the 35-mile stretch of beach along the South Carolina coast called the Grand Strand. Shag DJs keep the beach music euphoria going from 10 a.m. until *waaay* after midnight (*I've heard it goes on until 2 or 3 a.m. each night, but have not yet lasted that long, myself!*).

You will need an S.O.S. pass (cost \$35) to be able to go back and forth between all the clubs and lounges (last year we counted *twelve* (12) dance floors within a few block radius!). It is well worth the cost, believe me! In addition to the dancing, there are several complimentary buffets throughout the week, as a gift from the clubs to the shaggers. And it's all right there -- at The Beach!

Come join the party at S.O.S. in Myrtle Beach -- Shag Mecca, a dancer's paradise.

## A Female's Perspective . . . by Patricia Parrott

A male member of the club wrote a very interesting and informative article in last month's newsletter concerning an issue to which we all relate. That is the fear and intimidation faced when we ask someone who is above our level of ability to dance, the relief we experience when they graciously and cheerfully accept, and the benefit we derive from dancing with them.

It's great to hear a male's viewpoint expressed, but, there are two sides to the coin; the view of the female dancer and that of the dancer beneath our dance level. We all experience times when we wish we could dance just once with that great partner, the best on the floor. Yet, we hesitate to ask, believing that we don't dance well enough. Yes, we know we need to have the courage to ask, but it isn't easy. So, all of us dancers need to be aware of this side of the coin and put the shoe on the other foot, too. We all need to be willing to risk a less than perfect dance in order to ask others not as advanced in dance skill.

As a female, I believe we're more sensitive to this need. I've heard other ladies express the same thought, that we all need to ask people below our level, so it isn't only me saying this. Historically, ladies wait for men to ask. We've broken through that barrier, thank goodness. I vividly recall the first time I approached the best male dancer on the floor. I was surprised when he accepted, then more surprised when he suggested another dance; but I was overwhelmed by the rush that I felt afterwards. It felt so good to be in control that I wanted to do it again, and again. That incident was possibly the catalyst for me becoming the dance demon that I am today, though I soon had heard the whole range of refusal excuses.

Which brings me to another aspect of boy/girl dancing. Females are often reluctant to ask a male for a dance if he is married or with a lady friend, so as not to offend the lady. I learned this lesson personally when I was pushed aside in mid-dance by someone else taking my place. In these situations, it is up to the man and his lady to send the message that it's okay to dance with others. They need to be the first to ask.

Fortunately, these situations are not pervasive in the Northern Virginia Shag Club. We function as a team. Newcomers and beginning dancers often comment that they are made to feel comfortable by our warm, friendly reception. I especially heard this statement made over and over at our very successful Capitol Shag Classic weekend.

Courtesy of Larry & Shirley Jones of Richmond, VA (they make 15 trips per year!)

95 South to Lumberton, NC

Take Exit 14 (Rt. 74) -- TURN LEFT at end of exit, heading South...

Stay on 74 @ 26 miles until you get to Rt. 410 South -- TURN RIGHT

Stay on 410 through Chadborne until it dead ends.

TURN RIGHT onto 701 South.

About a mile down the road 701 will bear to the LEFT at Hardee's.

Stay on 701 to Rt. 9.

Stay on Rt. 9 to Rt. 17 South, into N. Myrtle Beach -- then you're HOME!!
