## You Who Watch. . . by Chris Pax

OK, I've done this competition thing now both ways. Usually I compete. This last time at the VA State Swing Competition, I watched. I sat on the sidelines and watched **Rick, Cecile, Bill, Melody, Janis, and Dan** go out there and dance like they've never danced before. They danced their fool hearts out. They all were fabulous. I mean, they were an INSPIRATION. Meanwhile, I sat in my seat, and watched. Just watched. Let me tell you, I simply do not understand how anyone can just watch. I nearly went nuts. I'll be out there competing again next year. This watching is for the birds!

How can you stand it, You Who Watch? How can you miss out on all that excitement out there on the floor? The thrill of walking out when they call your name, and having the whole club hooting and cheering for you, hoping you'll do well and hoping you'll make our dance look good. The practicing finally over, and now, the moment you have been both dreading and dreaming about. The thousand little details you worked to improve all dissolve away into a kind of mush in your brain: all you have now is instinct and habit. The music starts, you look at your partner with what you hope is a winning smile, and you're off!!!

People, **YOU DO NOT REALIZE WHAT YOU ARE MISSING!** Competing is incredibly fun! It's the biggest blast! Ask **Steve Mitchell!** He had cramps in his leg that would have stopped wild horses, but that couldn't stop him from hopping out there on one leg to finish the last round of his hand dancing competition! (Remembering that scene still brings tears to my eyes.)

The secret to being able to enjoy yourself out there is not to take the word "competition" too seriously. Don't "compete," as though the goal were to win. Instead, compete because you want to dance better than you've ever danced before, and because you know that having a deadline -- an event with an audience to provide adrenaline and to cheer you on -- is one excellent way to do it. It gives you a reason to practice a little harder. It motivates and provides discipline. Within the framework of the long-term goal of becoming a better dancer, it gives you a short term goal to shoot for.

I can't understand why we have so few shag couples in the competition every year. I have heard several dancers say something like, "Well... I would compete, but I think it would take all the fun out of it." While I must say that I respect the fact that they want to keep their dancing fun (that is, after all, the very most important thing about dancing, first, always and forever!), still I also wonder, what do

they think competing is all about? Do they think that they must win it all on their very first time out, or they will hang their heads in shame? That is an awfully tall order! In case you're wondering, the prize money in many cases won't even pay you expenses for the weekend. And the glory of placing first lasts about a week, or until the next dance...really not something worth getting bent out of shape over. And the scoring, in the end, really says more about the judges and what the judges liked, than about the dancers and how well they danced. Sometimes victories are established by only a few points' margin. You just can't take the results too seriously.

But the personal victory, knowing that you did your best, now that is something that lasts a little longer. And the things you learn while you're preparing to compete...well, ask any of the dancers who competed. I'm pretty sure they'll tell you they are dancing much better now, after the competition, than they did several months before the competition. Personal improvement is genuinely satisfying.

**Look at the bigger picture:** When you compete, you support this dance and our club in a dramatic way. The organizers of swing competitions are always experimenting with new formats. Shag has been added to several competitions lately along the East Coast. But in all the swing competitions I have attended, the shag division is struggling. The story is always the same: not enough competitors. Often there are so few shaggers that a competition that had offered two shag divisions, open and amateur, will end up having to put all the competitors into one single division in order to have a shag division at all. The state of shag in the swing competition world is not by any means secure. Shag may turn out to be a short-lived experiment, if we can't rally to get a few more shaggers out there competing.

That would be a shame because every year, for several months after the competition, we get a little surge of brand new shaggers wandering in, who first saw the shag at a swing competition. It's excellent exposure for the club and for the dance in our area. So if you'd kinda like to compete, but you're sitting on the fence, shadow-boxing with your ego, look at it as a service you do for the club or for shag in general. Egos tend to behave themselves a little better in the name of performing a service for a good cause. And this is a cause that absolutely needs our help. At the Virginia State Open Swing Competition over the past three years, the Lindy and Hand Dancer divisions have grown by leaps and bounds. Not true of the shag division.

**Now picture this:** It's October of 1998. There are not one, not two, but **THREE HEATS** of shaggers out there for the amateur division. That's nine couples!

And six couples for the open division, as well! People in the audience are murmuring to each other, "Wow, a lot of shaggers this year. I wonder where they dance around here?" And, "You know, that is a dance I'd really like to learn -- it looks so cool. I love the smoothness... and that footwork is something else!..."

What do you say, folks, can we make it happen?
