Every year, third weekend in January it's "Mid-Winter"

But - What is it?

Mid-Winter is really a party given by the ACSC to show appreciation for those that have contributed to and supported our clubs and been members all year long...no charge for admission, great DJ's and music, and free food, usually on Saturday, and on Sunday morning in some clubs.

And there's also an ACSC Meeting - and yes it's still at 9:00 A.M. on Saturday! And yes, any member of our club can attend any ACSC meeting...all are welcome (particularly if you volunteer to help with something!) However, each club only gets one vote, regardless of the number of members in attendance at the meeting. I'm never sure if the 9:00 A.M. time of the meeting is to make sure those folks that are there are TRULY dedicated, or if they don't want to interfere with the dance time later that day (which is a good thing!) And it's a great way to meet others in a relatively quiet setting who are also interested in shagging, keeping shag alive and in making a contribution to do that.

In addition to presenting numbers of clubs and club members represented at the meeting, they also announce how much has been contributed to charity by the clubs. This year 60 full member clubs and 8 subscriber clubs were in attendance, representing 10,295 shaggers... and the total \$\$\$ for contributions was \$195,650 - an average of \$3261 per club. Our contribution to Hospice last year of \$2000 was a wonderful start to increasing the average.

This year, under the guidance of Heather Jennings, we hope to do even better! Our jump-start on this will be our First Annual Shag-a-Thon on February 6 at Springfield Mall. Come and participate! Dance and raise \$ for our charity...if you cannot be present, support one of our club members who is dancing that day...and if you can be there and you don't want to dance, we always need volunteers for the day. Come, let's work on it together...we can make a real difference...it's what our club does so well!

1st Annual NVSC Shag-A-Thon! *by Heather Jennings*

On **February 6th** at Springfield Mall, the Northern Virginia Shag Club will sponsor the first annual Shag-A-Thon! The primary purpose of this event is to raise money for the club's charity, the **Hospice of Northern Virginia**, however by sponsoring the event at Springfield Mall, we also hope to promote the dance we love and attract new members to the shag club.

So, how does this Shag-A-Thon work? First - **sign up** on any Wednesday night prior to the event. After signing up, you will receive a **pledge sheet**. Take the pledge sheet to as many friends, family and coworkers as possible and ask them to "**sponsor**" you for this event. By sponsoring you, they agree to pay a certain amount for each dance you have during the event or they may choose to make a flat donation. (Note that the Shag-A-Thon is *not an endurance event* - you may dance as many or as few dances as you like.) Have each sponsor fill out the pledge sheet with their name, address, and pledge amounts. Please try and get as many pledges as possible! Prizes will be awarded to those collecting the largest amounts!

On the day of the event, **bring your pledge sheet** (and your dancing shoes!) to the Shag-A-Thon. When you arrive at the Shag-A-Thon you will be given a "**Pin On**" number - then **DANCE, DANCE, DANCE** and have fun! As you dance, one of our club members will note your number on a participation sheet in order to count your dances. The first Wednesday after the event, your pledge sheet will be returned to you with the "**Balance Amount**" calculated for each sponsor. (number of dances * amount per dance). Then return to each sponsor, collect the pledged amount, and turn in your pledge money to the club by **Wednesday, March 3, 1999**. **ALL proceeds** from the event will be given to **Hospice of Northern Virginia!!** It's that simple!!

Response: Due to the concerns about the disruption to our dance location (and therefore our dance night and workshops) that may result from the "Mixing Bowl" (I-95/I-495) construction (scheduled to begin Feb. 1999) an Alternative Locations Committee was formed (Dennis Gehley, Chair). Their charge was to look for other places for us to dance during this time. There will be an article in this newsletter about the results of their search. Should NVSC Dance Weekly Somewhere

Other Than At Blackie's???

In view of the road and interchange construction that will begin in and around Springfield in 1999, a number of club members asked NVSC officers and Board members to consider alternative locations for our weekly Wednesday night dancing, other than at Blackie's. In response to those concerns, the NVSC President established an Alternative Locations Committee, and I agreed to serve as Committee Chairman.

The NVSC officers and Board members are unanimous in their opinion that a decision to move our weekly dances from Blackie's to any other location should be made by all the club members, not just by the nine Board members.

Blackie's has been home to the NVSC for over 3 years, has served us well, and has helped us attract new members. Blackie's has a large and well lit parking facility, has allowed us to hold all day workshops and advanced dance lessons on Sundays, at no cost to the NVSC and has kept the cover charge at \$2.00.

In searching for a new location the factors that we need to consider are: [1] a central, relatively accessible location; [2] a hardwood dance floor with sufficient room for lessons and dancing; [3] a bar and, if possible, food facilities; [4] free, no-charge use by the facility for our monthly Sunday socials and quarterly all-day workshops; and [5] a safe, well-lit parking lot.

We researched, took referrals and visited several other establishments with the basic requirements. One business establishment in Alexandria, Virginia, is aggressively seeking to host dance clubs on a regular basis. That establishment - Nick's Restaurant and Nightclub - is about 3 miles away from Blackie's. I have visited Nick's several times in December and January to observe dance activities during the week and on weekends (as have several other board members and club members.)

Although there may be other facilities "out there" that meet the five factors cited above, at this time Nick's is the only establishment that we are aware of that meets or exceeds all of the criteria. We recommend that our members consider Nick's as an acceptable alternative to Blackie's as the future home for our shag club.
