We southerners don't always come to the point all that quickly. So, bear with me, please, for a little story about how shagging came to be for me.

It's all tied up with my brother Frank. He was my first shag partner. He was 8, I was 9. Teenage neighbors taught us to shag. It was Greenville, S.C. in the mid-50s, a time when adults still gathered on the front porches after supper and kept watch over children playing hopscotch and dodge ball in the streets. There in the street, on sweet summer nights under the street lamps and in between the dodge ball games, Frank and I learned to shag. He was that legendary kid present for the birth of rock 'n roll: a skinny little elementary school rebel who waited 'til the house went to sleep and then tuned his radio to some magical faraway place that broadcast Wolf Man Jack or rhythm 'n blues from Chicago or the deep Deep South....Soon, I never had to remember who sang what song. Frank remembered for me. And for everybody else in our neighborhood.

January a year ago, many of us -- going all the way back to grade school -- were having a reunion at Frank's house, a wonderful wreck of a shack on James Island, S.C., across the marsh from Folly Beach. By this time -- for perverse reasons no one remembers -- Frank had become "J. Fred" by nickname. Often spelled "J. Phred," for other perverse reasons that had something to do with Frank's profession as a scientist. (Ichthyologist. Fish scientist). He was J. Phred at Pholly Beach.... and his musical tastes had evolved, and in that shack by the marsh he had collected all the very best of all kinds of music, including, of course, our beloved R 'n B.

We all told tales of Frank introducing us to rock 'n roll. And of course, someone told that TIRED old story of how Frank -- the coolest 8-year old anyone ever knew -- just loved that song by Young Jesse, a song about how some woman is doing Jesse wrong and so Jesse sings "I smell a rat, baby." Lyrics that Joan heard completely wrong, and so she went around the neighborhood singing "I'm a little raspberry."

Then someone told about the James Brown show. We were in high school, and it was the good ol' days -- except not all of it was good, ya know. The city auditorium was booking rock 'n roll shows, but only after the City un-Wise Men had decreed that the white kids would sit in the balcony and the black kids would sit at floor level -- where they had the very good sense not to sit long. They'd invented this music, after all, and they were gonna GET UP AND DANCE. .. It took Frank about a nano-second to figure out that this balcony business was a bad arrangement-- and then he launched himself from the balcony and landed on stage, where he danced with the go-go girls... Alas, the security guards hauled him away, but it remains a shining moment in Greenville's rock 'n roll lore.

For me, all those memories are encapsulated in one great moment from December of 1998 -- just a few weeks before we gathered our friends to party at the marsh -- when Frank went to his CD player, put on a little beach music, took my hand -- and then we shagged. He was as smooth as ever, and he laughed out loud in pure delight.

But that moment at the CD player, that exquisite moment of grace and laughter? Frank was shagging, attached by a plastic breathing line to an oxygen bottle. It was his last dance. He died the next month. At 50. Of lung cancer.

The January party on the marsh (and it WAS a party) was our memorial service for Frank. Friends put his ashes into a basket, cradled him in camellia blossoms and carried him to the marsh. At the moment they gave Frank to the ocean, a breeze stirred and carried some of his ashes my way, and a bit of grit stung my cheek. It felt like Frank's kiss goodbye, and some of the music in me died forever. ...

And yet, some of the music will be forever more sweet and more joyful because it is the sound of Frank, who's still singing to us ---just from some other place, that's all.... And that will make it a pure joy to shag, two weeks from now at Landmark Mall, when our club has its Shag-a-thon for Hospice of Northern Virginia..... In the last week of his life, Frank sought guidance from Hospice and signed up for their home-based care. He died before Hospice could arrive, but Hospice already had served him well. Frank could turn with confidence to Hospice, because, not many years before, he had watched as Hospice nursed our father, also a lung cancer victim. Frank knew with absolute certainty that Hospice would give strength to his family and friends and compassionate nursing to him, and so he was less afraid.

The many people in our club who've lost people to cancer or who have survived cancer (and there ARE many, many survivors), already know who we're dancing for at Landmark. If the ghastly disease of cancer has spared your family or friends, please participate anyway and, if you will, please shag one shag for ol' J. Phred.

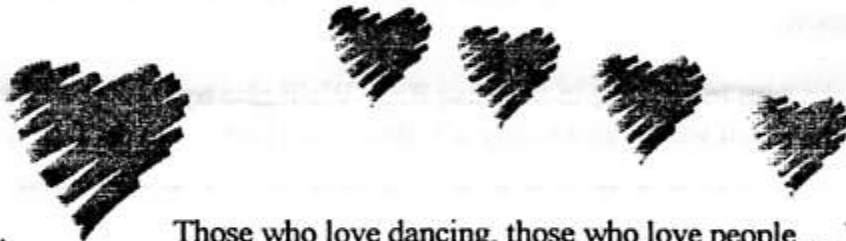
"P.S. from the President..."
