President's Message by *Joan McKinney*

Pat Parrott is leading a new project that we hope will engage and entertain all of you. With your help, Pat and other volunteers will produce a book about the **NVSC in the '90s**...something we want to complete before the artifacts and memories of our club's earliest years slip away.

Pat's team will draw from the club scrapbook and from photos that you contribute. Pat's also designed a questionnaire that jogs our memories about Founders and Charter Members, the Classic, other parties, road trips, SOS and ACSC, our DJs, our Dance Instruction Program, our Dance Competitors, the Shag Rag, our charity activities...In short, everything we've done in groups or as individuals that collectively became the NVSC.

Other 2000 initiatives: a golf tournament during the CLASSIC weekend; outreach to the Carolina expatriates in our area; some new club "logo" products; and a 2000 Yearbook.... We'd like to launch a "hospitality" program for newcomers. (**INTERMEDIATE CLASS GRADUATES**, you'd be great in this job. Please look inside the newsletter for details)... And we're renewing friendships with other dancers. (**ALERT: MARCH 25 WORKSHOPS** with Rick and Maureen Little, followed by a **JOINT DANCE** that night with **HAND DANCERS**. Wear a special t-shirt expressing our friendship. See Dave Shipp or Sharon Salpini.)

There's even a push to get a Beach Music program on local radio. It's a longshot, but Heather Jennings is making inquiries.

These initiatives are possible because of an ever-willing membership and because the Board of 2000 has an easier job than the Boards of the '90s. The Founding Fifteen and the earliest Boards did the hard work of creating something out of nothing. With a very small workforce, they left - among many other things - a governing structure, a dance floor, the Classic, and a calendar-of-events that, for the most part, is still used today. The next few Boards had the tough task of transition. They dealt with two new realities: A small membership of mostly like-minded people had exploded -- almost overnight -- into a diverse membership of 400 people who had a lot of different priorities. And, while the club must always be "just for fun" at the membership level, at the leadership level it now imposes some of the obligations of a complex, small business.

Because our members are so active and because our early Boards had vision and our latter-day Boards had flexibility, the 2000 Board has inherited a club that's very sound. Our task is simply fine-tuning what's already in place. We have the great luxury of dabbling in some fun things to enhance what we inherited....Please turn inside to learn more about these initiatives. And expect to hear soon from Pat Parrott. Your stories and pictures belong in our collection. You've all given us a very rich history in a very short time. *Joan*

FLASH!! Shag Workshop with the Pro's!... *by Steve Booth*

THE FIRST TIME I went to SOS, I stumbled into Ducks Too and went back to the dance floor. The first thing that caught my eye was a flat-top haircut in the middle of a drop spin and the flat-top's petite blonde dance partner. She floated as if on rollerblades while he executed the most perfectly outrageous leads and footwork. These were the first true Carolina-born shaggers that I had seen, and they still set the standard for me for absolutely beautiful and pure Carolina Shag styling. They were and are, of course, **Rick and Maureen Little** from Monroe, North Carolina.

For those of you who do not know them, Rick and Maureen Little have been dancing for twelve years and competing for ten years. They began their dancing career with lessons from Shad and Brenda Alberty. In their first year of competition, they were able to earn their way to professional status by winning three amateur and four novice contests. They have danced and placed in the National Shag Dance Championships in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina and the Grand Nationals in Atlanta, Georgia.

Rick and Maureen served on the National Shag Dance Team in 1997 and made appearances throughout North and South Carolina. They also had the opportunity to appear in Alabama's music video, "Shagging on the Boulevard." They have been the workshop instructors at Twisters Shag Club's Fall Cyclone for the past three years and have conducted workshops for the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs.

Rick and Maureen live in Monroe, North Carolina, where they teach group and private classes. They are still competing on the Competitive Shaggers Association circuit in the professional division.

On Saturday, **March 25th**, Rick and Maureen Little will be here to teach us how to Shag, the Carolina way.... **THREE** one-hour shag workshops will be held at **NICK's**, starting at 11 a.m. for the basics, followed by intermediate and advanced workshops. A special lunch menu will be available for workshop attendees. HIGHLIGHTS Board & General Membership Meetings in February

News from the **Feb. 8 Board Meeting** is dealt with in the President's Letter, and in the March Workshop and "Initiatives 2000" articles elsewhere in the newsletter. Here are some additional highlights from that Board discussion, and from the comments of members at the Quarterly Membership Meeting on Feb. 20.

TREASURY: Club operating account, \$2,132. Special account (the Classic), \$4,651. Charity account, \$2,525. (Does not include the \$13,000-plus raised at the Shagathon.)

BUDGET TASK FORCE REPORT: Club's biggest revenue sources: membership dues; profits from the shag workshops w/pro instructors and the post-workshop dances; income earned from attending ACSC and from prizes won at SOS. Biggest expenditures: the newsletter, an approximately \$2,000 subsidy to the CLASSIC weekend, Sunday Socials, the free Christmas Party.

LONGRANGE FISCAL ISSUES: Membership dues and the price of CLASSIC tickets have not increased. The CLASSIC raises approximately \$18,000 on its own, but does require the \$2000 subsidy.. Hotel costs (food, setup fees) are increasing, as are rental costs for party/dance facilities...The NVSC gives all of its profits from the weekly 50/50 raffle to Hospice of Northern Virginia, which is some \$3000-plus a year. Membership takes great pride in this initiative. However, it partly explains why we're somewhat constrained financially. Most other clubs use their 50/50 raffle tickets for club operating purposes.

We should evaluate several things: membership building and retention; fundraising projects that don't "nickel and dime" the membership to death, but that club members will enjoy (the Jack 'n Jill; new "logo" products; raffling a private lesson w/folks like Charlie and Jackie); raising dues and/or the CLASSIC ticket price (but the CLASSIC can't be priced much above the norm for weekend parties in the Carolinas); revising the 50/50 raffle policy. Corporate sponsorships: the CLASSIC GOLF TOURNAMENT is our first test, with proceeds shared with Hospice. Issues raised: would businesses sponsor a non-charity, purely dance function? We don't have a marketing staff; who'll do this and how? We're consulting w/shag clubs that rely heavily on sponsors.
