Gary and I flew to Tampa last week to join with approximately 210 fellow shag club members for a five day cruise which departed on Saturday around four o'clock. We spent Sunday at sea, arrived in the Cayman Islands on Monday and spent most of the day there. There were numerous shore excursions to take while there including a trip to Hell and a chance to swim with the stingrays – a not to be missed experience. We had done both of those excursions on a previous trip so we opted for a snorkeling trip and enjoyed seeing the beautiful fish and reefs that the Cayman Islands are known for. We set sail again late that afternoon and arrived in Playa del Carmen, Mexico on Tuesday, where anyone who wanted to tour the ancient Mayan ruins of Tulum got off and met up with us in Cozumel, Mexico where the ship was in port from 11:00 in the morning until 9:30 that night. While in Cozumel, we again had a choice of several shore excursions which included snorkeling, scuba diving, a tour of the island, laying on the beach, or shopping. Wednesday was spent at sea, and we arrived back in Tampa around 8:00 a.m. Thursday morning.

Our DJ for the trip was Judy Collins of Judy's House of Oldies in North Myrtle Beach. The instructors were John and JoAnn Chruch (I'm not sure where they were from). Be prepared to party hearty, because the dances at night didn't start until 10:00 p.m. and lasted until 2:00 a.m. If you've never danced on an elevated platform that is rocking and rolling at the same time, you don't know what you've missed! Luckily no one danced themselves off the platform.

There was also a pre-party, hosted by the Tampa Bay Beach Boppers and the Sun Coast Shag Club along with the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs, which was held at a hotel in Tampa where most people coming in from out of town stayed the night before we left. I never heard what the total count was for that party, but there must have been at least 250 people. The dance floor was very crowded, but a good time was had by all. The DJ was Jerry Munson.

There were a few kinks at the hotel for the pre-party, and the dance floors on the ship were rather small, but, other than that, we had a great time and would do it again. We got to meet a lot of nice people from shag clubs all over and see a lot of variations of the shag. It would be more fun, however, to go with a group of people from our own club, so next time this trip is offered, give it some thought. You will definitely have a good time.
