


At the ACSC meeting during Spring SOS, a very unique Shag Contest was proposed..... a contest composed of **amateur dancers** from each shag club in the ACSC. **Dancers must be a member of a shag club, and can represent only one shag club, cannot have danced in the Shag Nationals or the Grand Nationals, including Juniors who have aged up, and no Novice or Pro SPA/CSA dancers.** Amateur Division CSA dancers will be allowed to participate. This will be the first of an annual event, and all shag clubs have been asked to help make it a successful and important event.

It will work like this: Each club will have their own Shag contest (**tentative date for our contest August 23rd**) before the end of August, and then send their **1st and 2nd** place winners to the Premier Shag Contest Prelims and Finals in Myrtle Beach, S.C. The contest will be held at the O.D. beach and Golf Resort on Ocean Drive in North Myrtle Beach. **The Prelims will be held November 3 & 4. The Finals will be held December 8 & 9, 2000. Special room rates** for these two weekends are **\$49 per night -- ask for the special Premier Shag Clubs rate, and make your reservations early!!**

The contest will be judged by Olympic style judging, 1 through 10, with seven categories: Smoothness, Repertoire, Togetherness, Degree of Difficulty, Execution, Keeps the Beat, and Showmanship. The winners will be chosen by two dances in the Prelims and two dances in the Finals. Cash prizes will be given to the finalists.
