Shag A Thon by Jeff Kinchloe

Our third annual Shag-A-Thon for Hospice is scheduled for Saturday, February 10, 2001, from 12:00 Noon to 5:00 PM at the Landmark Mall in Alexandria, Virginia. This year's Shag-A-Thon, coming as it does just before Valentine's Day, will have a Valentine's theme. The idea behind the dance is to obtain a pledge of support for Hospice of Northern Virginia for each dance that you do or a flat amount in honor of your participation in the event. Checks are made out directly to Hospice of Northern Virginia (they have recently opened branches in Washington and suburban Maryland also).

This is a marvelous opportunity to share with your friends, family, coworkers and others your passion for our dance while raising money for a worthy cause. Last year was a dream come true for me. With a little sign on my back indicating that I was dancing for over \$50 a dance, I had women lining up to dance with me to ensure the maximum contribution to Hospice. Hey, as a shy person, I'll take any help I can get! My reward for raising the most money is I get to chair the event this year, which actually has been a fun assignment thus far.

At the recent wedding of a nephew, I had several people say that I was a real inspiration for everyone at the dances that preceded and followed the wedding. This amazed me since in comparison with many of you, I would consider myself somewhat of a novice. It also made me realize what a small group we dance enthusiasts are. I know there is a deep yearning out there amongst everyone to dance, so the Shag-A-Thon is a great opportunity to expand our circle of dancers. As we teach others this dance we love, our own enjoyment is greatly magnified. My 85-year-old aunt took some dance classes after her husband died. She said one of her biggest regrets was she and her husband never danced because he refused to dance. I feel a particular mission to get the guys off their commonly held position that they can't dance.

I had lunch recently with the President of Hospice of Northern Virginia who pledged to encourage greater participation from their employees, volunteers, and supporters. I am coming across more and more families these days that have been deeply touched by the experience of having a family member cared for by hospice.

In talking with some of you, I find that the biggest barrier to participation is embarrassment about asking for money. I want to reassure you that if done respectfully and without pressure, asking for money for a worthy cause can be a very intimate, enlivening, and fulfilling experience for both the one who asks and the one who gives. While asking for Shag-A-Thon contributions last year I often found myself being invited into some wonderful conversations about dancing and hospice. Sometimes I've even done some impromptu talks on the origins of shag ("when the jitterbug met rhythm and blues" according to the Smithsonian magazine) and coaching on the basic shag step.

Recipe of the Month by Nancy Roop

PUMPKIN ROLL

Cake:

3 eggs

1 cup sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda

3/4 cup flour

2/3 cup pumpkin

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 cups chopped nuts (optional)

Filling:

8 oz cream cheese, softened

2 teaspoons butter

1 cup powdered sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix all cake ingredients well. Grease a large, ledge cookie sheet and place wax paper on top leaving an edge to grab on to at both ends. Bake Cake at 375 degrees for 15-20 minutes.

Prepare filing by blending ingredients until smooth.

Sprinkle powdered sugar on a dish towel (not terry cloth), when cake is done let cool for 15 minutes and turn onto prepared dish towel. Then roll lengthwise and place in fridge for an hour or until you are ready to fill.

Unroll cake, spread filling evenly, roll cake up, wrap in foil and store in freezer. Remove and slice 15 minutes before serving.
