6th ANNUAL NVSC SHAG-A-THON

On March 27, 2004 at Springfield Mall, the Northern Virginia Shag Club will sponsor the sixth annual Shag-a-thon! *Now, what is a Shag-A-Thon?* This is our primary fundraiser of the year for the Club's charity, **Hospice of Northern Virginia**. In addition to raising money for such a good cause, we will be able to promote the dance we love and hopefully attract new dancers to our group. It is a fun event that dancers of all levels will want to participate in.

To participate in the event, you first need to **sign-up and receive a packet**. Packets are available at the club on Wednesday nights. Next, you need to take your pledge sheet to as many friends, family and co-workers as possible and ask them to "sponsor" you for this event. By sponsoring you, they agree to pay a certain amount for each dance you do during the event or they may choose to make a flat amount donation. This is *not* an endurance event - you may dance as many or as few dances as you like. Each sponsor needs to fill out a pledge sheet with their name, address and pledge amount - it is as simple as that! Please try and get as many pledges as possible!

On the day of the event, our DJ's will play our favorite tunes in the court **in front of Macy's at Springfield Mall**. Dancing will begin at noon and end at 5:00. Some of our friends from Hospice will be there to provide information about Hospice while we dance, dance, dance.

Over the years, NVSC has raised over \$75,000 in support of Hospice. If you can't dance that day, consider sponsoring one of the other dancers or just come by and cheer us on.

Volunteers will be needed to set up, work at a registration or information table, provide snacks, and clean up. Please put this on your calendar, pick up a packet to start gathering pledges/donations, and volunteer before being asked! NIGHTCLUB 2 STEP CLASSES BEGIN MARCH 3RD

The Dance Committee at its February meeting approved a change in the dance instruction schedule. Beginning on March 3rd classes in nightclub 2 step will replace the line dance classes which had been on the schedule once every four weeks. Ann West and Ernie Garcia have agreed to teach the nightclub 2 step classes for the next three months. They will be teaching beginner level nightclub 2 step classes on March 3rd, March 31st, and April 28th.

If you have noticed some of the couples in our shag club dancing this beautiful dance step to slower songs and want to know how to do this dance, then plan to take the nightclub 2 step classes and join Ann and Ernie beginning on March 3rd. The nightclub 2 step classes will be taught on the wooden dance floor while other shag classes are also going on at Nostalgia's on Wednesday nights.

After the first three nightclub 2 step dance classes, the Dance Committee will decide if the nightclub 2 step classes will be continued into the summer months. The decision to keep the nightclub 2 step classes on the schedule will depend on how many members are taking the classes and whether we can get instructors to teach the classes.

"She Just Wants To Dance." *By the NVSC Dance Committee*

It's a shag tune. It's also a description of a lady we know who comes to Nostalgia's on Wednesday nights.

She's often a newcomer --- but maybe not. She's often standing near the dance floor, maybe leaning on the divider wall 'tween floor and social area. She's sometimes with a girlfriend or two. She's very often all the way across the room, in the quiet sofa-and-coffee-table area.

She just wants to dance. But --- no matter that this is old-fashioned, or is politically incorrect, or is reverse-sexism, or is just plain silly --- no matter all that, she just can not make herself ask for the first dance.

Meanwhile, across the room, most often near the bar, groups of men are chatting with each other. One of the things they're talking about is --- women. They, too, wanna dance.

It's one of life's great mysteries why these two groups of very nice people take SOOOO long to find each other. ... And sometimes they never do, because she who just wants to dance and he who just wants to dance give up after a couple of weeks and stop coming to Nostalgia's.

There are a few things the **Dance Committee** can do to help build a bridge across the great Dance Divide

Make sure students are introduced to each other.

Call the Red Dot Dances, so that club veterans can get Red Dot newcomers out on the floor.

Provide name tags for those who want to wear them. Try to think up some dance "mixers."

But, Folks, -- Gentlemen and Ladies --- eventually somebody's gotta ask somebody else to dance.

She, he, they --- us --- we all just wanna dance.
