President's Message *by Cathy Metcalf*

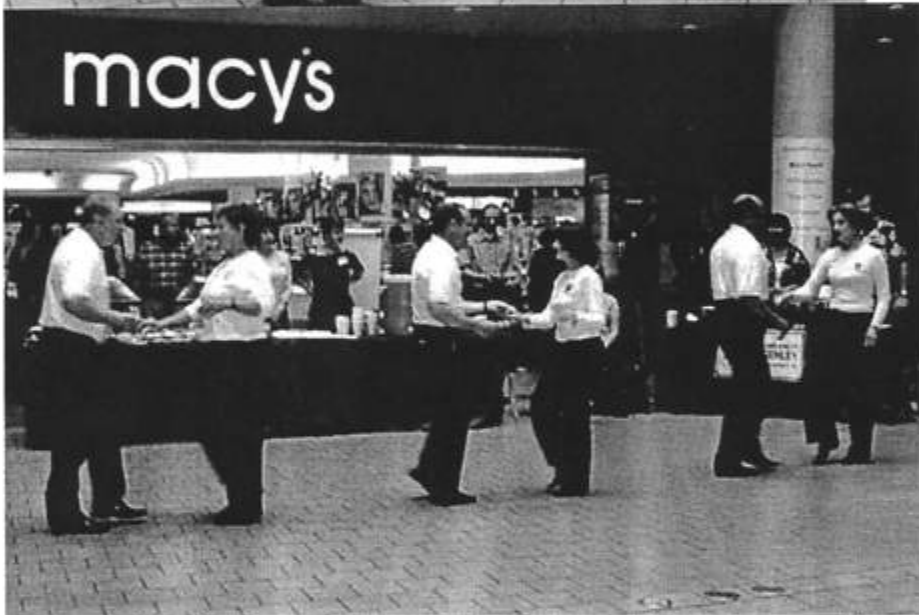

Also, I want to extend sincere thanks to **Pamela Alfano** and the staff of **Reed Smith** for their sponsorship of the event. With Pamela as the instigator, the law firm raised over **\$7000** through donations, a silent auction, purchasing the opportunity to wear jeans to work, and a couple of Happy Hour fundraisers. ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SHAG-A-THON FOR HOSPICE

We haven't counted the money or tallied the pledge sheets yet. To make the publication deadline for the April *Shag Rag*, this article is being written on the day after the Shag-a-Thon. Of course, we will let you know how the fundraising went, but we anticipate another highly successful fundraiser for our charity, Hospice of Northern Virginia. In its first five years, the NVSC Shag-a-Thon raised over \$75,000 for Hospice of Northern Virginia, every dollar of which went directly to the charity, with not a penny coming out of donated dollars to pay for overhead expenses.

This year, for the first time, we had a major corporate partner in the fundraising. Our former NVSC president, Pamela Alfano, arranged to have her employer, Reed Smith, one of the largest law firms in the United States, adopt Hospice as its charity for the first quarter of the year. Reed Smith worked with NVSC to raise money for Hospice from its attorneys and staff through various forms of fundraising, including two evening receptions to which NVSC members were invited and which featured shag dancing. We don't know the contribution total from Reed Smith yet, but we know it will be several thousand dollars. We are most appreciative of Reed Smith's interest and enthusiastic support. Maybe we'll even see some Reed Smith people take up the shag!

Putting together the Shag-a-Thon requires the volunteer efforts and talents and time of many NVSC members, all of which are gratefully acknowledged. Those efforts and talents and time include the wonderful shag demo dances done by NVSC members and juniors, the areas of public relations and publicity, making signs and graphics, providing music and sound equipment, donating snack items, cups, napkins, setting up, tearing down, registering dancers, answering questions for, smiling at and passing out information to interested shoppers, taking photographs, carrying and refilling water jugs and, yes, dancing for up to five hours on a hard tile surface! Thanks to my event co-chair, Marcia Conway, for the hard work, which she put into this year's Shag-a-Thon. We are also fortunate to have the experience of those leaders of the Club who created the Shag-a-Thon and brought it so successfully through its first years, leaving behind good records and suggestions for their successors on how to improve the event from year to year. Most of all, what makes the event work are the NVSC members who are willing to take the fundraising packets and go to their friends, relatives and co-workers, tell them about Hospice and ask for their support on behalf of this worthy charity. That is not always an easy thing to do. Thanks to you all for making it work!

Please turn in your pledge money to Marcia Conway or me by Wednesday, May 5th. You can mail your pledge money to NVSC, P.O. Box 5522, McLean, VA 22103, but do not mail cash. The Shag-a-Thon is over in terms of the dancing, but it is not over as far as fundraising is concerned. Try to collect the money which has been pledged, and remember that even though the dancing part is over, you can still make or accept donations, as we try to approach our fundraising goal of \$20,000. The money is needed by Hospice and will be put to good use.
