NORTHERN VIRGINIA SHAG CLUB SUPPORTS TOYS FOR TOTS

U.S. MARINE CORPS RESERVE TOYS FOR TOTS PROGRAM

MISSION: The mission of the Marine Corps Toys for Tots Program is to collect new, unwrapped toys during October, November, and December each year and distribute those toys as Christmas gifts to needy children in the community in which the campaign is conducted.

Toys for Tots began in 1947 when Major Bill Hendricks, USMCR and a group of marine Reservists in Los Angeles collected and distributed 5,000 toys to needy children. The idea came from Bill's wife, Diane. In the fall of 1947, Diane handcrafted a Raggedy Ann doll and asked Bill to deliver the doll to an organization, which would give it to a child at Christmas. When Bill determined that no agency existed, Diane told Bill that he should start one. He did. The 1947 campaign was so successful that the Marine Corps adopted Toys for Tots in 1948 and expanded it into a nationwide campaign. That year, Marine Corps Reserve units across the nation conducted Toys for Tots campaigns in each community in which a marine Reserve Center was located.

Marines have conducted successful nationwide campaigns at Christmas each year since 1948. The initial objective that remains the hallmark of the program today is to "bring the joy of Christmas to America's needy children." Bill Hendricks, a Marine Reservist on weekends, was in civilian life, the Director of Public Relations for Warner Brothers Studio. This enabled him to enlist the support of a vast array of celebrities to support Toys for Tots. Since then, celebrities as Bob Hope, John Wayne, Doris Day, Tim Allen, Kenny Rogers, and Billy Ray Cyrus have given their time and talent to promote Toys for Tots. First ladies Nancy Regan and Barbara Bush have served as national spokespersons. The Secretary of Defense approved Toys for Tots as an official activity of the U.S. Marine Corps and an official mission of the Marine Corps Reserve.

From 1947 through 1979, Marines collected and distributed new and used toys. On drill weekends during the fall, Reserve marines refurbished the used toys. From 1980 through the present, Marines have collected and distributed only new toys. Because of more operational demands on reservists time and the need to polish combat skills, no time was left to work on old toys. The goal is to deliver a message of hope, which will build self-esteem and, in turn, motivate these children to grow into responsible, productive, patriotic citizens and community leaders. A shiny new toy is the best means of accomplishing this goal.

Despite the trauma the nation experienced as a result of the 9/11 attacks in New York City and Washington, DC, the 2001 Toys for Tots campaign was the second best in the history of the program. Local campaigns were conducted in 388 communities covering all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

Today a non-profit foundation manages the Toys for Tots Program and helps to harness corporate and individual help in this noble effort.

For over 56 years of the Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program, Marines have distributed more than 313 million toys to 151 million children. This charitable endeavor has been made possible by the help of local clubs like the Northern Virginia Shag Club. Please bring a new, unwrapped toy to the Holiday Party on 11 December. We really need toys for age 2 and under and age 13 and above, but we'll accept all contributions. Together the Marine Corps Reserve and Northern Virginia Shag Club can continue to make a difference during the Holiday Season.
