Please, keep the questions and comments coming! I had a question and suggestion that I write about it in this article. So, here ya go. Question: **What's the difference between Beach Music and Shag Music?**

I was playing in Fredericksburg at our Battlefield Boogie Club one evening and was playing a Santana song; "The Game Of Love" and someone came up and said... "that's not Beach Music." My answer was...you're absolutely right, it's Shag Music and we're here shaggin'. As a matter of fact, a lot of today's Shag Music is not Beach Music at all!

Almost all Beach Music is Shag Music, but very little Shag Music is Beach Music.

Beach Music is considered to have a "classic" sound like the music you grew up with, a timeless sound. It stems from the music and groups of the Motown, Doo Wop, and Rhythm and Blues Genre. It's music like, Under The Boardwalk, I Love Beach Music, Miss Grace, 60 Minute Man, and others like these. They are all "Classic" songs. It's artists like the Tams, Drifters, Platters, Embers, Temptations, Four Tops, and so on.

These groups, just like the music they play, are also "Classic" and Timeless. The groups and their music have been around for many years and continue to be a major part of the Beach and Shag world. Shag Music, on the other hand, can be a song and artist from many different genres, having a danceable beat. Today we're dancing to a wide variety of music genres. Pop, Country, Oldies, Jazz, Blues, Adult Contemporary, and Top 40, just to name a few. Any music that has a shagable beat falls into the Shag Music category.

So, when you hear music or artists that you are not familiar with, don't discount their effectiveness as a dance tune. This is why the better DJ's try and put together a mix of different genres of music and artists. It broadens our musical appreciation and gives us a varied musical beat, instead of a steady one all the time.

Remember, music is in the ear of the individual listener. So open them ears up and take in the best music around...Beach & Shag Music!

And now for the pop quiz! - The country group, Alabama, did the song "Shagging On The Boulevard." What type of music is it; Country, Shag, or Beach?
