## Junior SOS

Years ago, there was an effort to put on an SOS-type event for those who were not old enough to attend the adult SOS events at North Myrtle Beach. (See shagdance.com for more about SOS.) The idea was to give the Juniors who already danced a chance to have fun, and a chance to help others learn to shag in a safe environment. It was hoped that the event would increase interest in shag dancing, and encourage new young people and their parents to participate.

The first "Junior SOS" was held one afternoon at a lounge named "Smiley's" in Charlotte, NC. There were about 30 or 40 young people that first year. It was a one-day event with hamburgers and hot-dogs on the back deck (it rained) and dancing inside. Everyone had a ball and knew right away that we had to have one every year.

The event is now held in the Ocean Drive area of North Myrtle Beach, SC. Several of the adult lounges open their doors and hearts to the Juniors for that weekend and always work with the JSA to make the weekend great for the kids. If you are not familiar with North Myrtle Beach, the participating lounges are within about 200 yards of each other and the beach.

Junior SOS exposes a lot of youngsters and their parents to the dance for the first time. So, the entire event is planned to make sure the first-time shaggers have every opportunity to learn to dance, and have a lot of fun doing it. The weekend is crammed with activities such as:

- A Junior Mixed Doubles Contest
- A Battle of the Sexes Line Dance Contest
- A Junior SOS Car Wash
- A Junior Visit and Exhibition At a Retirement Home

OK, let's get started on our tour of Ocean Drive. Think back, it's September and it's Fall SOS. We'll start out 2 blocks off Main Street at H's of O.D.. It's new, it's clean, it's exciting. The dance floors are huge and there are two dance floors outside with a bar, bandstand and DJ booth. The place is packed, especially with a lot of locals. No need to show the SOS card, it's free! The music is current beach music and old blues thrown in. The floor is packed. Well, it's time to leave. Can't waste time here. Our next destination awaits!

We'll head back towards Main, but cut through the back yard and go in the back door of Fat Harold's. Get your SOS cards out, they be checking! It's smoke-filled and the blues are jumpin'. Joanne Johnson is spinning the tunes. The dance floor is packed. Let's push our way through the crowd and head towards the front room. Careful, don't get burnt by a lighted cigarette.

The front room is wall to wall. Push hard and take every chance to get through. Hey, there's Wilkie Waley blasting out some old 60's Beach music. The dance floor is so packed. Taking more than a very short basic step is almost impossible! But hey, look at that fool over there...trying to hand dance...in this crowd, good luck. Just glad I'm not next to them! Well, this is fun, but we must be off. Say goodbye to Harold, we'll see you later.

Let's cross the street and head for Ducks. We'll start upstairs...get out your card! It's packed and the floor is full. There's a light smokey haze hanging over the crowd. It will take some time to get through the crowd to the back and downstairs to Ducks Too. As we pass the DJ booth wave to Craig Jennings, he's playing some (probably unfamiliar to you) good dance music. Finally, we make it to the door downstairs. Wow, another crowd, but distinctively different music. Ah, isn't that Earl Bostic I hear? Yea, and it's Butch Metcalf and Steve Baker playing. Watch out, Cooter is coming through with his hands full, but always a "hey, how's it goin'." Let's make our way out the back door and head towards Ocean Blvd.

Next Stop, Pirate's Cove. Not as big a crowd, but still crowded. The sound system is blaring blues music and the floor is crowded. This place has probably the best sound system and floor on the beach. Don't see anyone we know, so let's head out back and stop by the Pad.

We really need to stop by here because there's word on the street that they want turn this into a parking lot! How crude. Oh well, there's a blues band on the side deck and the inside is smoke filled and crowded.

We'll head out the side door and across the street to the Arcade. It's a block building painted white with green signs. Remember, the Smoothies contest was here on Thursday. Smoothies...I just love watching the good dancers move to the music...poetry in motion! OK, let's cross the street and stop by the Boulevard Grille.

We'll go in the front and say hi to Connie, the owner. The front is busy with customers eating and the bar is full. Let's head to the back room where Larry Jones is playing great old blues...isn't that Vesta and the gang dancing?

Hey, let's join in the party. It's really smokey and hot in here, let's go out back on the patio and cool off and dance some more.

Time to head to the Pavilion and hear Little Tommy Hamerick play some really old beach stuff...my favorite! Let's stay out on the back deck and enjoy the cool ocean breeze while we dance the nite away.

OK, did you enjoy your trip down memory lane? Let's now take a look at 2005. The Pad and H's are gone. One is a parking lot, the other an empty site where a condo is going. Harold's back deck has been remodeled and is non smoking and the upstairs of the OD Café is non smoking.

The Pavilion has done some renovating, with a few new additions. Ducks has changed owners and the upstairs completely renovated. The dance floor is huge and the DJ booth is in the middle. There's another entrance, so traffic moves easier. The Grille and Arcade haven't change a bit, yet!

A huge change is the Music and dancing in Ducks. You'll hear a Line Dance and a slow dance quite often. Before, that's something you'd never hear.

The crowd is also changing. And, not just at Ducks. We're seeing younger people involved. That's a good thing! If we don't propagate, we'll loose it!
