

Going to SOS, no matter how many times you've been before, is like a new experience each and every time I go! Some days, you just want to kick your feet back and enjoy listening to the music and watching the dancers. While other days, you want to try and do everything!

For most of you who never had the pleasure of meeting Chicken Hicks before his death, you have missed probably the most outspoken, genuine purveyor of this dance, lifestyle, and music we all have come to love.

... In 1948 Chicken and his buddy Jim Hanna opened a beer joint in Carolina Beach called the Tijuana Inn. Problem was, they got bored with the music the jukebox companies were providing them.

So, being the enterprising fellow he was, Chicken made many trips over to Seabreeze, the black section of the Grand Strand, making lists of the music that was being played. He finally talked Hanna into putting them on the jukebox at their place. There went the neighborhood! As Hanna put it, "you couldn't get in the place; the people just loved that music."...Hard driving black rhythm & blues.

Not only did everyone love the music, but the dances that came from it; the big apple, jitterbug, and a dance that someday would become the shag. Eventually, this frenzy of volatile black music and white kids got them run out of Carolina Beach.

Well, the music started moving down the coast and this new "Bop" music was showing up on jukeboxes all the way to North Myrtle Beach where it found a permanent home. Now, this forbidden music was no longer called "Bop"; it was simply called "Beach Music."

You can buy a cup of lemonade almost anywhere, but if it didn't come from a young kid behind a stand, it doesn't taste right. You can buy sweet tea all over the country, but away from the Carolina's, it loses something. You can listen to Beach Music almost anywhere in the Carolina's, but in the clubs of North Myrtle Beach, you don't just hear it. You feel it; deep inside, like a rumbling thunderbolt ready to explode.

So, when you see me tapping my feet or thumping my fingers, you'll know exactly what I'm thinking. It's probably giving me the same feeling that it gave to Chicken Hicks and Jim Hanna back in 1948... When I have this music playing and I'll be good to go!

SHAG ETIQUETTE

ASKING A PARTNER – It is equally permissible for a woman to ask a man as it is for a man to ask a woman to dance. Take your partner's hand onto the dance floor and at the end of the dance thank your partner.

If you don't want to dance, say, "No, thank you." Don't dance with someone else, if you just turned down a request to dance.

Please, if someone says "No thanks," do not be persistent; take them at their word.

It is not polite to correct your partner on the dance floor. Remember, this is a social club (have fun).

It is not polite to offer instruction to someone in a social dance setting (or in a dance class, if you are not the instructor). Let's face it; you may be the one doing the step wrong. Unless they ask for help, or are hurting you, don't teach. If your partner requests help, kindly take them off to the side away from the other social dancers.

DANCERS BUMP INTO THE NICEST PEOPLE, and it isn't even a contact sport. Be aware of the dancers around you! If you bump into someone, kick someone or step on someone's foot, or if they bump into you, apologize whether it was your fault or theirs. Show concern that no serious injury has occurred. It's a fairly accepted practice that when a collision occurs, apologize, EVEN if it wasn't your fault.

DANCERS USE SELECTIVE FLOOR PLACEMENT – Find your Spot and keep your Slot! The first person on the floor usually has the right to set the slot of the dance.

DANCE SMALL! If you require half of the floor in order to do your thing, you need to change your thing! Nobody likes to be bumped around the floor. Sorry, but unless you're on a stage, you're not the only one on the floor.

PLEASE step off the dance floor if you're not dancing. If you are drinking a beverage of any kind or smoking, keep off the dance floor because of damage to the floor.

LEADERS – if dancing with a less experienced partner, keep the steps simple at first and build to the level that your partner can handle. Leading should be defined as "the art of making your partner comfortable." Work as a team, don't showboat.

LEADERS – protect your partner; since you are directing her movements, you need to be sure to protect her safety.

LEADERS – if you must count and give verbal leads, keep it low enough that just you and your partner can hear. It can confuse those around you and besides, just because you can count doesn't mean "you are on the beat."
