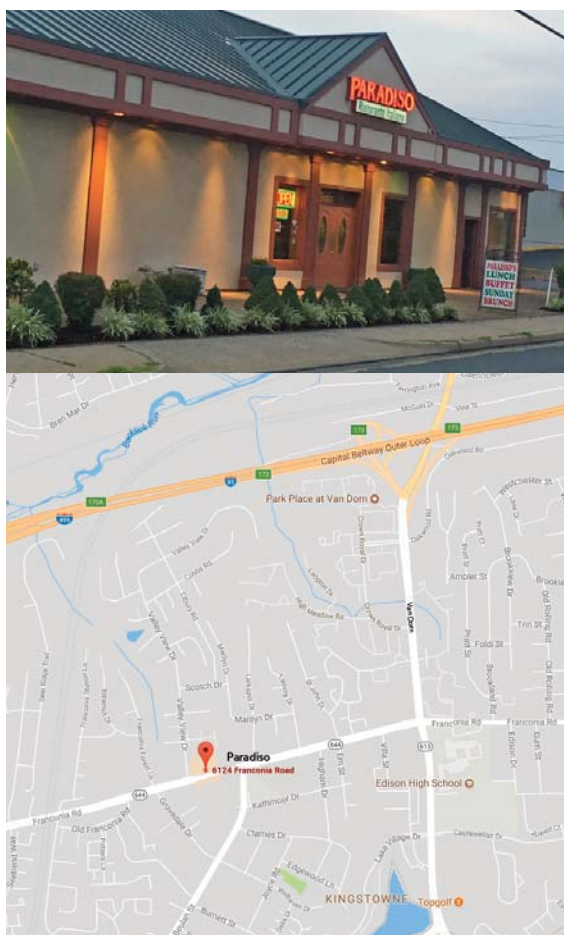

stabilizing influence for NVSC going forward into 2018. I would appreciate your vote on November 15.

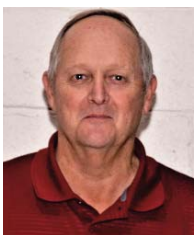
For Directors at Large

Cruisin' with SOS

It started with a plane ride and an unexpected airport meeting.

I departed Washington Reagan Airport on August 17 and flew to Toronto. As I was walking through the airport, I looked ahead and saw someone I thought I knew— fellow NVSC member Sherri Wildoner. Never one to be shy, I called out, “Sherri!” That person started looking around and thankfully, yes, it was Sherri (who never expected someone to shout out her name in the airport). She had arrived about the same time as I did, but on another flight that had originated in Maryland. We had a chuckle over and then continued that chuckle over brunch and drinks while we waited for our flight to Vancouver. There we would set sail on the Celebrity Millennium on the SOS at Sea–V cruise.

This was a big ship. But, although my stateroom was large enough for one person, if I had had a roommate it would have been a tight fit. Cruises are floating activity centers. Pretty much whatever you want to do you can do (and enjoy) while at sea. There was a library, an internet room, an art gallery, various stores, and a selection of restaurants. There were even classes to take and special activities such as the Chef’s Table (Sherri, Jewel Pradier and I did that). Dinner in the main dining room had two seatings — early and late. The assigned seat was yours for the entire cruise, but you could move around if seats were available. At night the ship rocked with stage shows, adult comedy shows, bingo games, movies, and a casino. There were numerous lounges where you could drink/dance the night away. The Martini Bar was a big hit with the SOS crowd (shocker!). We had three dances in the Cosmos Bar during the cruise just for SOSers that were not open to the general public. Furman Dominick was the DJ for the dances.

The solar eclipse happened during our cruise and we had been furnished with the special eclipse-viewing glasses. It was overcast that day, so a lot of us watched it on the huge screen on the top deck while wrapped in blankets the ship graciously provided as it was a cold and windy day.

Each port we stopped at offered various land excursions we could enjoy. Our first port was Ketchikan where you could see totem poles, take a

city tour, catch a floatplane, spot some bears, adventure, sample a taste of Alaska, do some fishing, or soak up some culture. At our second port, Icy Strait Point, you could take wildlife sightseeing, adventure, or fishing tours. Juneau, our third port offered a whole raft of adventures: floatplane, helicopter, wildlife sightseeing, adventure, dog sledding, fishing, or Mendenhall Glacier tours. At Skagway, port number four, you could take helicopter rides, wildlife sightseeing, adventure, or White Pass train/bus tours. On the way to our Seward, the last port, we sailed quite close to the Hubbard Glacier. It was the closest the ship had EVER been to the glacier and it was breathtaking to see/hear the ice breaking off of the glacier and falling into the water.

At Seward some of the SOSers returned home. Other SOSers went inland on a Denali Land Extension trip. In Talkeetna you could experience flightseeing, jetboarding, zip-lining or tour the town. In Denali you could take a Tundra Wilderness Tour and hopefully see the top of Mt. Denali. Day two featured flightseeing, rafting, and guided hiking tours and then dinner in a domed railcar while taking a train trip to Fairbanks. Then, in Fairbanks, in the morning you could cruise on the Chena River aboard a sternwheeler and in the afternoon tour the Morris Thompson Cultural and Visitors Center and see the Trans-Alaska Pipeline.

What a trip. Alaska is a breathtakingly beautiful state. And being able to do the tour as part of Good SOS friends? The best!

More Shag History

SOS Origins

Gene Laughter, an ex-lifeguard from the Fifties—nicknamed “Swink,” was a mischievous and creative man. He used to entertain his family on summer vacations by writing notes and putting them into bottles, then casting these into the ocean. This practice became elaborate and got out of hand in 1978. A note on an aged parchment found in an antique bottle wound up at the offices of the *Charlotte Observer* newspaper.

The note was supposed to have been written by marooned sailors on a whaling vessel that had sunk in 1887. The Charlotte Mint Museum authenticated the find and the story went out over the wire services, gathering a bit of national coverage. The Whaling Museum of New Bedford, Massachusetts promptly reported that the discovery must be a hoax, for the supposed ship, the Ann Alexander, had gone down to Davey Jones’ locker thirty years before the date of the note.

No money had changed hands on account of the hoax, so the prankster did not go to jail. However, Swink Laughter’s name became familiar to Charlotte newspaper columnists, Kays Gary and Jerry Bledsoe.

When Laughter decided to hold a reunion of old beach bums in 1980, he convinced Bledsoe to feature the story. Several articles appeared on the history of the Shag and Laughter’s effort to get the beach bums back together. Laughter himself spent a great deal of time and energy tracking down old acquaintances. About a month before the party was set to kick off, a second antique bottle containing a note was found on the Carolina shore.

Once again, Laughter had struck. This time the *Sumter South Carolina Daily Item* was duped. After the story ran locally, it was picked up by the Associated Press. For several days, maritime archivists all over the country scrambled, either to verify authenticity or expose a fraud.

In reality, the note was a coded, open invitation to Swink Laughter’s reunion. Anyone familiar with the upcoming festivities, or with rhythm and blues music, would have seen straight through the double entendres. Captains Earl Bostic and James Rick were rhythm-and-blues group leaders. Bostic’s ship, “Flamingo,” was the title of a hit record. “Raven” referred to Jimmy Ricks and the Ravens. Oak Tree was the name of the revelers and September 11 was the kick off date of the beach party.

Laughter owned up to the hoax at a national press conference in Richmond on August 26. He had managed to garner a bit of national advertising for the price of an antique bottle and a scrap of old paper. The beach bums’ reunion was off to a clever start.

Laughter expected perhaps five hundred people to show up on Ocean Drive. Something like two thousand souls migrated.

From Bo Bryan’s website:

I’m a Southern writer, raised a gentleman trained to open doors and carry packages. I am well mannered, if not always polite. I write for pleasure. I wiggle my fingers over a magic board and words appear like pixie dancers, telling in motion the stories. I capture the motion to preserve moments, to share my astonishment for the visceral ballet of head, heart, and spirit that is a human being, and a miracle.
