



COUNTDOWN to the CLASSIC: four months away!

The CLASSIC LOGO & its CLASSY ARTIST, DON BORJA



Don and Audrey Borja were recent additions to the NVSC a decade ago when Don designed a logo and turned it into a giant, poster-board sculpture for our annual weekend party, the Capital Shag Classic. Don's such a low key and quiet man that, of course, he didn't tell us this was a gift from a nationally known artist. Don is one of only two official sculptors for the US government. Possibly his best-loved work is a memorial to the lost Challenger astronauts. It's a sculpture of their faces, placed over the astronauts' shared grave at Arlington National Cemetery.

What's the concept of the Classic logo? What inspired it?

Don: "Audrey and I had been in the club for about a year and we went to the Capital Shag Classic. It was maybe only the second Classic ever, at the old Holiday Inn. I just thought the club needed something for the Classic, a logo for the Classic. I thought about it, and thought about it – what could best represent our club? And eventually it came to me that we are in Washington, DC, where it all happens. And all of us, we're all, "We, the people."

Don designed a backdrop that included the US Capitol and the club's regular logo (shaggers and an old 45 record.) He made those as huge, three-dimensional components, covered in red, white and blue glitter. For the center of the piece, Don made a scroll that was lettered in old-fashioned script, like an unfolding Declaration of Independence. Don's message said: "We the people of the Northern Virginia Shag Club, welcome you."

Don: "It took me about 3 months to make. It's made of plastic sandwich board. That's for the cutouts of the Capitol, the dancers... The "We the people" scroll, that's like a window-screen material, a metal screen that's bendable and foldable. I covered that with plaster. And after arranging all the pieces, and after about 4 or 5 pounds of glitter – well, there we have it."

The finished product weighed 25 to 30 pounds. It was almost 6 feet tall and 4-and-half feet wide. Don thinks that, when the lights hit all that glitter just right, the logo appears to move and sway like a dancer wearing sequins. His favorite place for the logo is in the hotel lobby, where the Classic's arriving guests can see the welcoming message.

Don: "When I got through with it, I was really pleased about it. I was so excited about shag. We were new to the club and so new to shag. It just became a labor of love. It was for the pleasure of it. Nobody asked for it. It wasn't requested by the Board or anyone. I just knew I was going to do it, and if nobody wanted it, I was gonna hang it in my house. ... Now, sometimes I look back on it and I think, well, what I can do with my hands, I would hope to do with my feet someday. I know I can do with my hands. But after 11 years of shagging, it's still getting the feet to execute."

You've done other art work for shag. A design, approved by the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles, for a proposed "shag tag" license plate. Audrey's earrings when she dressed up as DJ Joanne Johnson for the SOS parade.

DON: "The first thing you see with Joanne Johnson is her earrings, big earrings. So, it was easy for me to visualize much larger hoops. And I got these parakeets --little toy parakeets, like you can get at Michael's or one of those crafts' places – and I made some very large hoops and put the parakeets in the hoops. Then I attached them to earring clips, and it was a done deal. When the parade was over, Joanne tracked Audrey down and said 'I have to have those earrings', so we gave 'em to her."

Don works for the Institute of Heraldry, which designs medals, seals, badges and monuments commemorating historic people, places and events. Don designed a relief-sculpture of Navy Vice Admiral James Stockdale, the longest held POW in Vietnam. The sculpture is on a plaque that's presented to fleet commanders in the Pacific. Don's been called "the keeper" of the President's seal.. He did the model for the oval-shaped White House seal that's seen on TV when the President speaks to the nation. The Pentagon also uses a Don-designed plaque for appearances by the Secretary of Defense.

Several years ago, Arlington Cemetery advised Don that his memorial for the Challenger crew was its second most-visited site, behind only the eternal-flame memorial for President Kennedy.

Tell us about the memorial to the Challenger crew.

DON: "NASA gave me a box of photos to work with, photos of each of the seven astronauts who died.... I made precise molds, and a model of the sculpture. The surviving spouses all came to the Institute to give their blessings. All except the husband of Christa McAuliffe, because he was too distraught to deal with it, and he just gave his blessing to whatever we could do.... The difficulty in respecting and working with someone who's grieving is that they remember their loved one in so many different ways. Almost all of the spouses wanted me to give their loved ones just a little more smile. I don't really like to do that sometimes, because I don't want to falsify anyone. But it was only a few little changes they were asking for, and I did a few things and they were all satisfied. That was very gratifying.... The former superintendent at Arlington told me that, because of the number of visitors to the memorial, they put in a walkway and put it on the tour bus schedule... This has been a very proud and personal thing to me, to be able to do this for the families and also to be recognized in this way by our government."



Audrey and Don are members of the NVSC Dance Committee and volunteer instructors for our Wednesday night classes. They compete in the amateur division of the Competitive Shag Association (CSA). The Borjas have hosted the club's summer picnic, and Audrey has served on the NVSC Board. They also are co-founders and officers of the Battlefield Boogie Shag Club in the Fredericksburg area.

The Easter Bonnet contest and Egg Dance were lots of fun once again this year. About a dozen festive springtime enthusiasts came out on March 19th with their Easter Bonnets for the annual Parade. Creativity was certainly the norm – and the judges had a tough time! Congratulations to the winners: 4th Place – Fran Mong; 3rd Place – Jean Teele; 2nd Place – Tom Brett; and 1st Place – Ray Jones. Ray's Bonnet was made from his hard hat, and the judges fondly named it the "Safety Bunny".

The Egg Dance was a challenge, indeed, as the DJ's increased the steps and tempo of the music to get the dancers to drop their eggs. Congratulations to the winners – Fran Mong and Paul Young, and second place dancers John Wood and partner Stella.

My Junior SOS experience:


My experience with shag dancing began about 1992. Since then I have been to many SOS Spring Safaris and Fall Migrations, attended nearly all of our Capital Shag Classics, as well as numerous celebrations presented by other clubs and have seldom missed our Clubs regular weekly dances, from the time we began at the Juke Box Cafe, to Blackie's, then Nick's, Cecilia's, Nostalgia's and now Rene's. I mention this to assure those who may not know me very well, that shag dancing has been and continues to be a fantastically rewarding hobby of mine. So, it may surprise you to know that my **most rewarding shag experience has been attending the**Junior SOS, even though I am more than 40 years too old to be a junior. In the shag-dance world you must be under the age of 21 to be a junior. However, if you have junior children, or junior grand-children, or know someone with junior children, or have a friend who knows someone with junior children, etc., you may want to consider taking them to the Junior SOS. I did this for my granddaughters, **Hailey and Jasmine**, for the first time in July of 2006.

They were a little skeptical at first, but eager enough to try it. After all, it was in the middle of July, and we would be at the beach. The first couple of days they attended the group beginner lessons, perhaps more as a favor to their "Pops" than anything, and were clearly more interested in the beach and our hotel's "lazy river" than in dancing. But by the third day, I could see they were beginning to notice how much fun the dance could be. Seeing the happy faces on the junior shaggers did the trick. I knew they were hooked when they began begging to come back next year even before we had left North Myrtle Beach to head for home.

Of course, we did return in 2007. They were into it with both feet from day one. The pictures show Jasmine hugging Pops after a dance at the OD Arcade and Hailey (right) along with Jada (granddaughter of Janis Grimes) watching some of the junior competition at Ducks. (Many thanks to our Club's expert photographer, Tom Brett, for those shots.) One evening, Friday I think, at about 11:30 PM, when Pops was nearly worn out, I thought I could lure them out of Ducks and back to the hotel using ice-cream psychology. So, I told them that we would have time for ice cream at the Sugar Shack if we left right away. They chose more dancing, their love of ice cream notwithstanding.

Dear NVShag Club Members,

As co-chair of last years Capital Shag Classic, in charge of keeping track of the budget, I was startled to hear some talk that the Club had paid for rooms in the Dulles Hilton that were unaccounted for. This prompted me to take another look at the Classic budget. To my surprise and horror, I found out that it was essentially true. Here is what happened.

At the conclusion of the Classic I paid the bill presented to me by the Hilton, and, of course, the Club reimbursed me for that amount. What I had forgotten to consider when looking over the bills was that we were to receive 1 room night credit for every 50 room nights of paid attendees. That fact was NOT included as a credit on the bill. Instead, it was included as a credit on my charge card, the bill for which I received a month later. When I paid my credit card bill, which had numerous other personal charges, I carelessly overlooked the credit from the Hilton. The bottom line is I unknowingly had \$291.03 of the Club's money for the past 8 months. That has now been paid back to the Club with interest.

Please know that this mistake was mine alone and completely unintentional. The good news is that, with this correction, last years Classic netted over \$4000.

Shag Tag Update

Remember the shag tags? You may be wondering where they stand. They are still very much alive. Sometime this summer we will begin distributing DMV license application forms. They must be completed and returned to Valerie Swiger with a check to cover the cost of the license place.

The cost of the license plate is \$10. If you desire a personalized plate (any combination of 6 letters or numbers), it will be an additional \$10 added to that for a total of \$20. The DMV will bill each applicant for the standard vehicle registration fee. The applications and fees will be held by NVSC until approximately November when they will be turned over to the Richmond Shag Club (RSC).

The RSC will then present the applications to the Virginia House of Delegates Transportation sub-committee in January 2009. There must be at least 350 applications submitted from the Virginia shag clubs for the tag to be approved. Based on the survey the shag clubs conducted last year, we should have more than enough applications when that time comes.


