A Brief Explanation from Your Treasurer About the \$6 Cover Charge at Nostalgia's

At the December 2002 monthly meeting of the NVSC Board, new Board members for 2003 and the 2002 Board discussed the issue of how much the cover charge should be at the Holiday Inn Fair Oaks club Nostalgia's, the new "home" of the Northern Virginia Shag Club. Based on input from new Board members Cathy, Dave, Gary and Jane and discussion of NVSC cover charges at our previous locations in Springfield, Alexandria, and Arlington during the last 9 years, the Board decided that \$6 was an appropriate cover.

The \$6 charge will accomplish four main objectives that the Board considers reasonable, appropriate and fair for all parties concerned:

- [1] pay Holiday Inn's charge to NVSC of only \$100 each week to use Nostalgia's as a private party on Wednesdays, a rate which the Board considers to be extremely reasonable and generous to NVSC;
- [2] pay the \$45 salary of a Holiday Inn employee (Todd) to work as our doorman throughout the evening;
- [3] compensate NVSC DJs in their capacity as independent contractors at a rate of \$2 for the evening for each person who pays the cover charge; and
- [4] set aside any funds over and above those needed for objectives 1, 2 and 3 and use such overage for the benefit of those NVSC members and guests who patronize Nostalgia's.

Experience after only three weeks at Nostalgia's in December indicates that the Board's decision to charge \$6 appears to be acceptable to the general membership. Attendance has ranged from a low of 36 persons on the very bad weather night of December 11 to a high of 83 persons on "opening night" December 4. After only three Wednesdays, membership support through attendance at Nostalgia's has resulted in over \$300 from over charges already being set aside by the Board for eventual return to those NVSC members who support Nostalgia's.

The Board encourages our fellow NVSC members to let us know what you think about various ways we can reward those members who support Nostalgia's and NVSC by attending our weekly lessons and dance. What about a free beer night at Nostalgia's? How about a "No cover charge" night? Would you like to see a monthly or quarterly Happy Hour night? Maybe even an occasional Open Bar night? My friends, let your imagination go wild! The more people who show up at Nostalgia's and pay the cover, the larger the amount we can set aside to pay you back for our support. Remember: it's your club. Use it or lose it.

P. S. The Board also voted that there would be a \$200.00 ceiling on the amount of money that any DJ will be compensated for at Nostalgia's on any Wednesday. This means that once 100 people have paid the \$6 cover on any given evening, 100 percent of the \$6 cover charge becomes "overage" eventually to be returned to Nostalgia's attendees. Is that a sweet deal or what? So get out there and support yourself by supporting Nostalgia's your home away from home on Wednesday nights!

HERE'S A GUARANTEED INVESTMENT TIP FROM YOUR TREASURER: BUY NVSC

Is your retirement plan on hold because the stock market is in the toilet? Is your 401(k) something you are ashamed to talk about because you feel silly about the bad advice you listened to in 2002 and the bad investments you made, or the good investments you did not make? Are you looking for something that is most guaranteed to bring you a better return than the stock market, bonds, gold, commodities, real estate, art, collectibles, or pyramid schemes? If so, you should be looking at continuing your membership in the Northern Virginia Shag Club. And you should be out looking for friends to join the club and share in the dividends that come from belonging to NVSC.

Case in point: how much did you invest in NVSC in 2002, and what was your return? If you are a typical member of the club, you spent \$20 to either join the club or to renew your membership. In return, those of you in town received such dividends as free dance lessons on Wednesday nights for almost 50 weeks at such varied establishments as Nick's in Alexandria, Cecilia's in Arlington, and Nostalgia's and Rene's in Fairfax. You attended free (no cover charge) NVSC events such as the June pool party at Gary and Robbi Mann's house, the Sunday Social with Night Club Two Step lesson in August, the pre-S.O.S. party at the Coast Guard Station Anchorage Club in Alexandria in September, and the Holiday Party at the Springfield VFW in December. Everyone in the club who paid their dues contributed to the \$1,900 subsidy that the Board voted to spend on these events for the general membership. So far, it seems like a pretty good return on a \$20 investment. NVSC is actually like a small business that operates at roughly a \$50,000 annual spending level, including a \$25,000 birthday party for its 375 "shareholders" and guests.

In addition, everyone in the club benefited during 2002 from a very special category of NVSC members who contribute more than the \$20 that we all pay. Those special people are called volunteers, and they are the people who give up their time for the benefit of their fellow members, something more valuable than any \$20 could be. Some people volunteer to be officers and members of the Board and act on behalf of the general membership. Some people volunteer to go out and get pledges to dance and run our annual Shag-A-Thon and Golf Tournament to benefit Hospice of Northern Virginia, to the tune of over \$66,000 donated since 1999. Some people volunteer to write for or edit our monthly newsletter, the Shag Rag. Some people volunteer to be dance instructors for members new and old. Some people volunteer to register people at our workshops, to collect the cover charge at our parties, to share their homes and their food with out-of-town dance instructors and DJs, and to transport out-of-town instructors to and from airports. Some people volunteer to decorate the hotel for our annual birthday party, the Capital Shag Classic, or to decorate the Springfield VFW for our holiday party. Some people volunteer to help our Social Committee Chair prepare the food and beverage before and after our parties. Some people volunteer to staff our hospitality table or our logo products sales table at the Classic, when they most likely would rather be out there dancing and socializing like the rest of us. Some people volunteer for one event or function, some people volunteer for an entire year, some people volunteer year after year. If the subliminal message in this paragraph is not clear after being said once and repeated ten times, then let me spell it out: **some people volunteer.** Everyone benefits.

Another way of looking at the volunteer equation is this: what happens when people don't volunteer? The simple answer is this: things don't happen, and everyone suffers, even if they are not aware. Here are two examples about volunteering far from home. Does anyone know why the Northern Virginia Shag Club, which several years ago won First Place Marching Group in the first two S.O.S. Spring Safari parades it entered, no longer participates in the parade? The answer is because no one volunteers anymore to be in charge of planning and decorating and organizing an entry for the parade. Former volunteers are generally off volunteering for other things, and you can't volunteer to do everything. Likewise, does anyone know why the Northern Virginia Shag Club has had one and only one entry in the S.O.S. Miss Fun Monday contest, an entry that won First Place over 12 other shag clubs? The answer is because no one from NVSC has volunteered to enter. **(continued on the next page)**

So here we are, making plans to celebrate our unofficial 10th anniversary in 2003 as a club, and yet we no longer are even a minor player at premier semi-annual S.O.S. shag events in North Myrtle Beach such as the parade and the beauty (?) contest. In fact, NVSC isn't a player at all anymore.

The same principle applies to a whole range of activities close to home on a weekly and monthly basis: when people don't volunteer, things don't happen, and everyone receives less from their investment, whether or not they realize it. Actually, it would not matter even if our club dues were \$50 a year, the principle would be the same: **volunteers make a voluntary organization go and grow. It's not just about money. Without volunteers, all the money in the world would just sit there.**

As we might suspect, some volunteers get tired, some lose their enthusiasm, drop out, burn out, chill out, or disappear altogether. Some move on forever, others eventually return. All of that is natural and is to be expected in any dues-paying, voluntary organization like NVSC. Of course, some members are gluttons for fun or punishment, or both, and they keep coming back to volunteer week after week, month after month, and year after year. (We hope and pray that those people are receiving professional help to cope with their disease.) The point here is that most volunteers at some point will want to eventually phase out and pass the torch to the next volunteer. Is anyone out there? What about you?

As I step down from the pulpit after my annual sermon to the choir and my fellow believers, I urge all of us to keep our \$20 membership dues coming to this fine dance club and to find and sign up new members. And for those of us who can, I encourage you to give some thought to volunteering your time and talents in some capacity to NVSC in 2003. We will be a better club for it, you'll know more about what it takes to keep a great club great, and we all will get an even greater return on our investment than we already do.

IN CASE OF INCLEMENT WEATHER:

If the weather is lousy and you think an Northern Virginia Shag Club event might be canceled, check the hot-line (703-960-4254) and find out the latest. If a decision is made to cancel or postpone an event, for any reason, the hot-line will be the first place that information is made generally available.

The hot -line is actually a Verizon voice, mail box, which means it can handle up to five calls at one. Feel free to call it often. As a rule-of-thumb for the Wednesday night dances, if the DJ thinks he make it, there will be no cancellation. Under normal conditions, the hot-line will contain, a hopefully, up-to-date information about future events - like who will be the DJ for the next Wednesday dance and what will be taught in the lessons.
