## 1<sup>st</sup> CSA/SPA shag contest held in Virginia!!!

The Carolina shag is alive and well in Virginia, with active local shag clubs in many cities of our state. However, until recently, there had never been a sanctioned shag contest held in Virginia. Well – that all changed last month as the first \*CSA/SPA shag contest ever held outside of the Carolina's took place July 11 & 12 at the Holiday Inn – Koger Select on Midlothian in Richmond, Virginia. What a terrific weekend!

The contest weekend started on Friday evening with dancing in the Visions lounge from 6-9 pm. At 8pm, the ballroom where the contest was to be held opened for dancing with guest DJ Butch Metcalf spinning the tunes. So for a little while, there were actually two places to shag in the same hotel!!! Dancing continued in the ballroom until the contest began around 10:00. The first division to take the floor was the Amateur division, which consisted of 9 couples, four of which are members of NVSC (*Rob Baen & Sheila Purkey, Larry Black & Cindy Goree, Steve Booth & Janis Grimes, and Kevin & Joan Byrnes*). Everyone danced wonderfully! Following the Amateur division, there was open dancing for awhile and then the contest resumed with the Novice (Intermediate level) division, which consisted of 7 couples, two of which are members of NVSC (*Earl & Beverly Robinson, Ralph & Vicki Tedesco*). More great dancing by everyone!!! Following the Novice division, open dancing and partying continued until 2:00 AM! Whew, my feet were tired, but we had a blast!

Saturday the fun continued with two shag workshops taught by National Shag Champions Charlie Womble and Jackie McGee. As usual Charlie & Jackie, taught some great technique tips as well as some new steps for everyone! After the workshops, it was off to Visions again for hot dogs, snacks, and more dancing.

Saturday evening began again at 8:00 with open dancing in the ballroom. The shag contest resumed around 9:00 beginning with the Junior I division (under 15 years of age). There were 3 couples and they were all incredible! Immediately following Junior I, was the Junior II division (ages 15-20) which had two couples. Both couples were AWESOME!!! Again, several of the competitors have ties to NVSC. (*Tori Robinette, Brennar Goree, Kari Jones, and Amanda Tedesco.*)

Following the juniors, there was a short break for open dancing and then the Professional division competed with 6 couples participating, one from NVSC. (*Heather & Craig Jennings*). The pros really put on a great show for the 250+ spectators at the contest!!! After the Pro's danced, the floor was open for everyone to strut their stuff while waiting for the results of all divisions. We were even treated to some delicious cake donated by "Cakes by Graham." All in all a terrific weekend of divisional competition, food, fun, friendships, workshops, awards, door prizes and a heck of a 50/50 (\$800!). \*CSA stands for the Competitive Shaggers Association, an organization comprised of competitive dancers that participate in an annual schedule of shag contests.

\*SPA stand for the Shag Preservations Association, an organization made up of several "clubs" and their owners for the purposes of promoting and preserving the shag. As an example, both Ducks and Fat Harold's in Myrtle Beach are SPA members. Several other clubs, such as Visions in Richmond, are also members of the SPA organization. SPA clubs sponsor shag contests one or more times during the year.
